Calvary is a Reconciling in Christ congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA)






Praise the Lord!




Evening Schedule

Hosting the Wopila is our way of saying thank you to all the congregations, partners, and friends who have supported this journey of ministry and healing.
