Five Officials Selected for 2019 Induction into the Oklahoma Hall of Fame for City and Town Officials

Five officials representing a wide range of experiences will be inducted September 19 into the Oklahoma Hall of Fame for City and Town Officials. The black-tie optional hall of fame induction ceremony will be held in the **International Ballroom of the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel Tulsa Downtown** in conjunction with the Annual Conference Banquet for the Oklahoma Municipal League.

They will become the 65th – 69th inductees into the Oklahoma Hall of Fame since 2001.

Those to be inducted this year were recently announced by the Oklahoma Hall of Fame for City and Town Officials Foundation, which is supported by eight organizations of Oklahoma municipal government officials or service organizations.
