This year's focus is Feline Diabetes Mellitus and our goal is \$15,000. We also have matching funds available, so every dollar given will be doubled, up to \$15,000.


Consider this- \$15,000 in gifts, + \$15,000 in matching funds = enough to completely fund one feline health study.

## CLINICAL TRIAL

Feline Chronic Gingivostomatitis, or FCGS, is a severe and painful disease that affects the mouth. Recent Winn-funded studies have led to a potential treatment called DentaHeal. A study is currently being conducted by Dr. Boaz Arzi at the University of California-Davis and VetCell Therapeutics USA, the manufacturer of DentaHeal.
