

FAQs:

What is a Rain Barrel or Compost Kit?

Rain Barrels are a way to harvest and store the rain for later use. They are hooked into a gutter and use fresh rainwater anything for which you need outdoor water. Water conservation reduces energy use and can save money.

Composting is a way to take leftover waste and turn it into fertile soil. The Compost Kits provided at the workshop represent types of composting strategies so you can choose best one for you or your church.

Can I come to only one workshop?

Of course! You can participate in one of the workshops or both.

Can I just show up?

We need you to register so that we have enough supplies for every participant. Also, installing Rain Barrels and doing a Composting system are pretty simple, but do take commitment, so registering is a way for us to know that you really are interested.

Can we sign up as a congregation?

If you sign up as a church, you will receive resources for one building and as many congregants can participate as are interested. Installing a Rain Barrel and doing Compost on church property is safe, to-code, and easy, but make sure that these practices are something your faith community wants to do.

Can I sign up as an individual?

Absolutely. Spots are limited, but registration is first come, first served.
