



What is Rally CLE?

Rally CLE exists to unite and engage residents around the ideas they have for improving their communities by supporting projects that promote **connection, equity, and grassroots leadership**. We support residents in the Clark-Fulton and Stockyards communities through small grants (up to \$2,000 per project), project planning support, neighbor engagement assistance, as well as the volunteer and/or professional support needed for your project to succeed. 


