## Ms. Keber- Drama, Upper School

- ★ **Rotation Classes:** We began the quarter studying various aspects of play analysis. Each grade is focusing on a specific type of theatre and is writing original works in that style.
  - 6<sup>th</sup>– Pantomime
  - 7<sup>th</sup>– Commedia Dell'Arte
  - 8<sup>th</sup>– Analysis of the full-length musical *Footloose*
- ★ **Make-Up Design:** Students have been practicing basic corrective make-up and old-age make-up. They researched the difference between middle age and old age and techniques to delineate between the two.
- ★ **Play Production:** Focus this quarter is on acting techniques in scene study, voice and movement. Students have been implementing scoring technique from the Stanislavski System in contemporary scene study.
- ★ **MS Drama Enrichment:** Students are deep into preparation for the SC Thespians Junior Theatre Festival on April 27th. They are preparing individual pieces in solo, duet and group acting and musical categories.

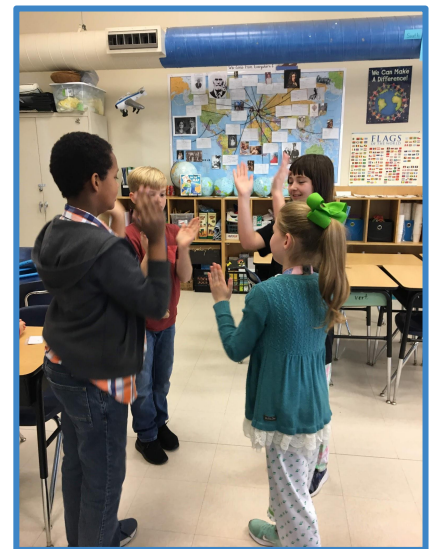

## Ms. Bowen- Global Studies

- ★ The children have truly enjoyed listening to tales of one of the most beloved folktale characters of Puerto Rico, Juan Bobo. While getting a few laughs from the character's silly predicaments, the students have learned a bit more about Puerto Rican life through the characters and events that typify the culture and spirit of the people.
- ★ We listened to a wide variety of Caribbean music: calypso, merengue, salsa, soca, and reggae. Students were taught how to identify some of these different styles by listening for particular traits. The best part of the lesson was getting to play the maracas and bongos to calypso music. A special shout out goes to Mrs Lemons' Middle School Idea Lab students for creating these instruments for Global Studies.
- ★ For a couple of weeks, the Global Studies room was filled with the wonderful aroma of Caribbean spices. While playing a game of "Guess that Spice", students had to rely on their sense of smell to identify Caribbean spices that are popular in their cuisine and/or grown in the region.
- ★ Puerto Rican circle games and Jamaican hand clapping games have been fun to learn in class. These traditional children's games, still played in the Caribbean, show that some things never go out of style. This was clear as the students found amusement and challenge in playing them.
- ★ Many of the classes are preparing for our sixth annual Lower School Global Fair, Friday, April 26th! The kindergarten classes have been busy making Jamaican bandana belts that they will be wearing during their performance.
