


"Grateful for God's Gifts" **Thanksgiving Eve Worship** 7pm, November 21

2018 Church Council Election Results

On Sunday, November 11 Jeff Schwartz, Britteny Rolfes & Angie Webert were elected to serve on the Providence Church Council. We are grateful to all the candidates for offering to serve the church in this capacity. For those not selected, we hope you will consider running again next year as we anticipate 6 spots potentially opening up. A special thank you to Abbe Whitacre and Rob Sizemore who have come to the end of their terms on Council — Providence has been blessed with their leadership.

Notice to all members:

SPECIAL VOTE to be held DEC 15, 2018
A vote to Amend the Church Constitution regarding the length of council terms will be held December 15

Section C12:02 of the constitution currently reads: The members of the Congregation Council except the Pastor shall be elected by written ballot to serve for <u>2 years</u>.

Proposed change:

The members of the Congregation Council except the Pastor shall be elected by written ballot to serve for 3 years.

Note: Each member of Providence Council currently serves a 3 year term, and that has been the historical practice at Providence. When we passed our updated constitution in 2017, we inadvertently have the term listed for 2 years. This bylaw simply conforms to our current practice. Pastor Todd and Executive Team of Council recommend passage of the bylaw.

When you visit the Angel Tree. . .


- 1. Sign out the Angel tag of your choice from the tree.



Tithe means "a TENTH part". It's a word used all through scripture. In the Bible, God tells us that we're to give the first ten percent of all we earn back to God. It's up to you to decide if that's before or after taxes!

HOW TO USE THIS CHART

- 1. Figure out your monthly income
- 2. Determine what you currently give per month.
- 3. Locate your monthly income on the chart.
- 4. Slide right to find your monthly giving.
- 5. Move left at least one percent to calcluate your new monthly giving.
- Write that amount on your pledge card.
