




RETURN TO IN-PERSON SERVICES

A Note from your Warden

- Your safety is our top priority.
- No one should feel obligated to attend in person. If you are not comfortable being around others, it is okay to stay at home.

In-Person Services Starting August 23, 2020

- There will be one service only at 9:30 AM.
- Please do not arrive more than 15 minutes before the scheduled service time.
- **Face masks are required. No one will be allowed entrance without a face covering.**


Prior to Entering Church

- **PPE Check: Face masks are required to enter.** No one will be permitted to enter the church without wearing a face covering. The only exception is children under the age of 2.
- **Health Screen:** You will be asked if you are experiencing any fever, coughing, or other COVID related symptoms. Anyone experiencing symptoms or who has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 will not be allowed to enter church. If you are feeling sick, please stay at home.
- **Contact Tracing:** Greeters will confirm your contact info. In the event we are informed that someone who attended our worship tests positive for Covid-19, we will then communicate to everyone who attended that worship service.
- **Sanitizing:** You will receive a squirt of hand sanitizer before entering or touching church property. This is a requirement for entry.



Church Seating

- Please enter through the front door only.
- Church capacity is 16 spaces that can be occupied by an individual or by persons living in the same household.
- When at capacity no one else can enter.
- Certain pews will be roped off in order to maintain social distancing.
- Please sit where the ushers tell you to. Pew choices will not be permitted at this time.
- Please let the ushers know if you are unable to sit upstairs for health reasons.



Service

- Single use Sunday bulletins will be placed on the bench in church for you to pick up.
- A collection plate will be available for collection as people enter the church.
- Choir and acolyting have been suspended until further notice. Singing of hymns is not permitted at this time.
- The Sacristy will be off limits to everyone except for clergy and lay readers to reduce opportunity for contamination. The bathroom will be off limits. **Please use the restroom before you get to church.**
- When leaving, place the single use Sunday bulletin and any personal trash in the box at the exit for recycling at a later date.
- Respect social distancing when exiting the church and remember that there may be others behind you who wish to exit.



Communion

- Communion will be offered each Sunday using consecrated wafers only.
- We will not use the Altar rail to distribute Communion.
- We will mark six foot spacing and parishioners will receive Communion at the front of the church.
- Masks should be worn at all times inside the church. Please wear your mask or face covering during the receiving of Communion.
- Communion should only be consumed after you have returned to your pew.



Coffee Hour

- Coffee hour will continue to be via Zoom until further notice.

Final Words

- Exposure to COVID-19 is an inherent risk in any public location where people are present; we cannot guarantee you will not be exposed during your visit.
