



CCP- To Note in December

The [Continuing Competence Program](#) (CCP) is a regulatory requirement that supports nurses, as self-regulated professionals, in examining their accountability to their practice. The CCP is a prospective process, which means that in December a self-assessment of your nursing practice against the standards of practice to determine your learning needs ([step 1](#)), and the preparation of your learning plan for the upcoming practice year ([step 2](#)) should be completed. For more details on steps 1 and 2: CCP. Note that where some other professions require a specific number of hours of continued education credits, there are no mandatory hours of education for your CCP.

Completion of a [mandatory learning module](#) is a CCP requirement to ensure that nurses are aware of legislation, regulations, standards or guidelines that affect nursing practice. Standards for Cultural Safety is the 2025 CCP module. It is available in your “My Profile” account, and should take about 30 minutes to complete.

The learning module has 3 components:

- 1- Review the document.
- 2- Watch the webinar.
- 3- Complete the quiz (with a minimum score of 80%)

CCP AUDITS:

Each year, NANB selects registered nurses and nurse practitioners for an audit of their Continuing Competence Program (CCP) submission from the previous practice year. In accordance with NANB by-laws (Article 1.03G), this audit process ensures members meet CCP requirements and remain accountable as self-regulated professionals.

The CCP supports ongoing professional development, competency maintenance, and public protection. All active-practice RNs and NPs must complete the CCP to renew their registration.

CCP audits begin in January. Only those selected will be contacted by email addressed specifically to them. After the audit is completed, members will be notified whether they have met all requirements or if additional information is needed.
