

CRAAG'S Top 10 Advocacy Issues

1. Increase provider reimbursement rates for waiver services.
2. Incentivize service providers to expand waiver services.
3. Encourage innovative person-centered housing alternatives.
4. Fully fund the DD Waiver List starting with **Priority One**.
5. Educate/train more licensed/credentialed providers in I/DD fields.
6. Create an appeal process for SIS and algorithm disputes.
7. Research the appropriateness of the SIS for adults with autism.
8. Research the appropriateness of the rates algorithm for adults with autism.
9. Adopt the "menu of services" versus "package of benefits" for waivers.
10. Fully comply with the DOJ Settlement.

With a mailing list of almost 700+ self-advocates, family members, and professionals, **CRAAG** constantly monitors the issues facing individuals with autism and other developmental disabilities.

Active **CRAAG** team members are largely family members of the most underserved group of those with developmental disabilities — *those who range in age from late teens to adulthood!*

CRAAG's team is keenly focused on housing options, supports and services to assist our family members in living as independently as possible — before a crisis means that family members can no longer directly advocate, care and support their loved ones.
