You Can Use CA newsletter. To understand the experiences and preferences of individuals with ASD and their families in navigating ASD information, supports, services, and resources, CA Human Services has contracted with Knowledge Advisory Group (KAG) to conduct focus groups and surveys. KAG will also collect input from service providers and partners in the ASD professional community for this initiative. At the conclusion of this study, CA will share the results with stakeholders across the Commonwealth and work together to remove barriers to improve the experience.
