## **Update on December 2, 2020 Inclusive Housing Forum**

At the end of 2020 CRAAG and DBHDS District 1 Housing hosted a virtual Inclusive Housing Forum featuring Paula Manion and Donna Budway, two dynamic parents representing City Center NOVA (CCN), now rebranded as <a href="Our\_Stomping Ground">Our\_Stomping Ground</a>. It drew 70 registrants and an audience of 44+ self-advocates, family members, DD providers, developers, affordable housing advocates and other community members.

CRAAG's primary goal is to make tangible progress on expanding housing options and associated services for adults with DD. This goal and various objectives will be discussed at the Jan. 27th CRAAG meeting. All are welcome, including those who attended the Dec. 2 Forum!
