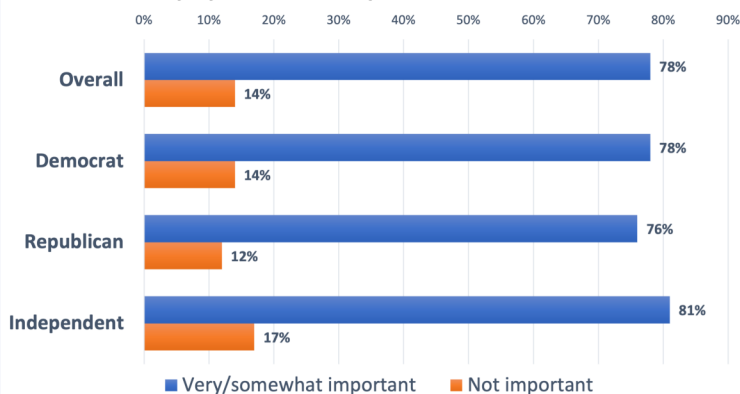


Redistricting poll: Georgia voters strongly favor competitive districts that preserve their communities and reflect our diverse population.

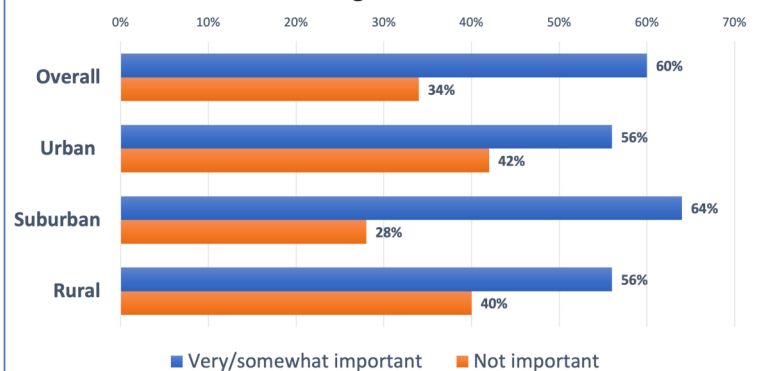
Key Findings

- Overwhelming majority of voters from both political parties favor competitive districts that preserve their communities
- Large majority among all racial groups favor maps that reflect racial diversity. Opinions differ by political affiliation.
- Georgians have low confidence in fairness of current maps and low satisfaction with map-drawing process
- Significant majority favor new law mandating non-partisan process. Majority support independent redistricting commission.

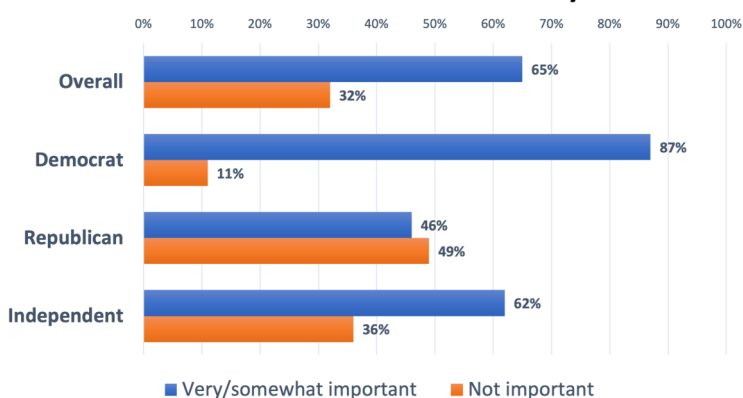
How important is it to you that Georgia's election maps prioritize competitive districts?



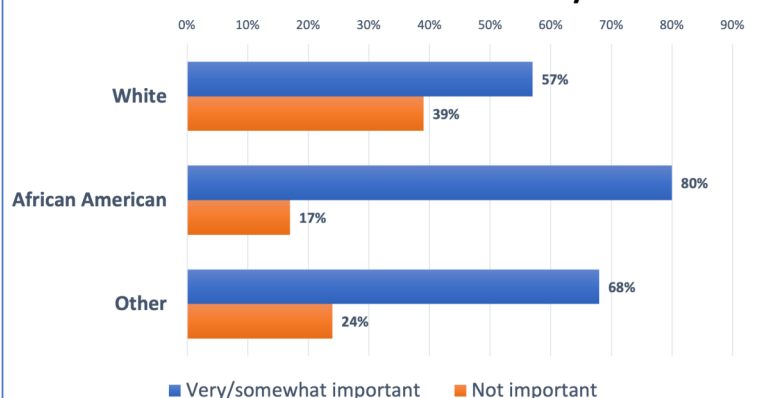
How important is it to you that Georgia's maps prioritize keeping "communities of interest" together?



How important is it to you that Georgia's maps reflect the state's racial diversity?



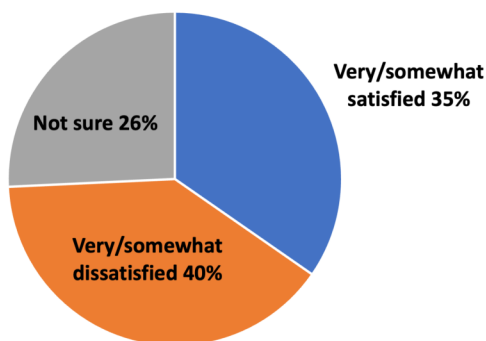
How important is it to you that Georgia's maps reflect the state's racial diversity?



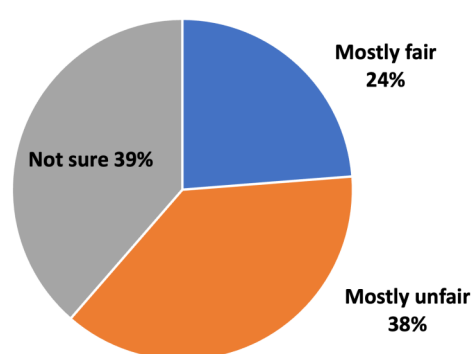
Redistricting poll: Georgians have little confidence in fairness of current redistricting method, strongly favor law mandating non-partisan mapping and/or independent redistricting commission.

Georgians have low confidence in fairness of current maps and low satisfaction with map-drawing process. Far less than a majority are satisfied with the process and think maps are fair.

How satisfied are you with how redistricting is handled in Georgia?

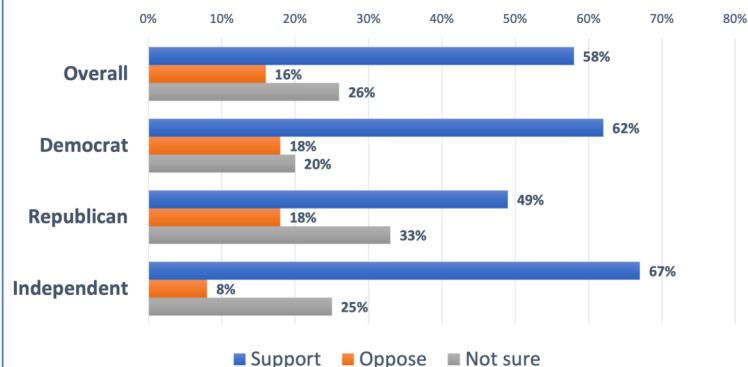


From what you know, do you think the maps legislators drew were mostly fair or mostly unfair?

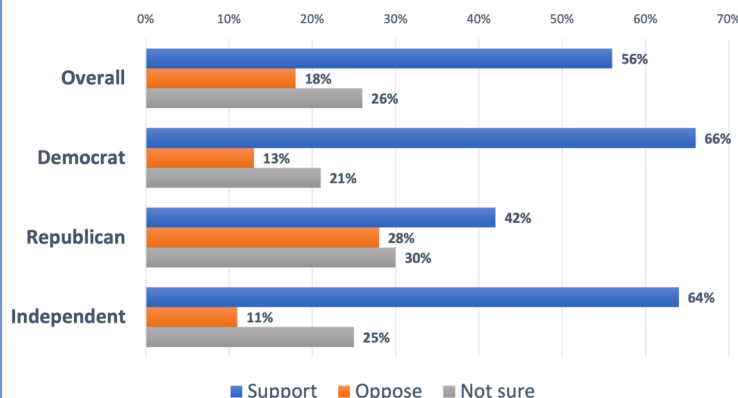


Significant majority across parties favor changing the law to mandate a non-partisan process. Majority support independent commission for drawing maps.

VOTER AWARENESS OF REDISTRICTING

Percent of voters reading or hearing "a lot" or "some" about redistricting is 57%, higher among Democrats (67%) than Independents (52%) and Republicans (48%).

Fifty-two percent of Republicans have heard "just a little" or "nothing" about redistricting, resulting in higher "unsure" responses for map fairness (49%), satisfaction with the process (36%) and support for non-partisan reforms (33%).
