#### Dear Friends:

Delores Dufner, a nun of the Order of Saint Benedict at Saint Benedict's Monastery in Saint Joseph, Minnesota and a faculty member at Saint Benedict's College and Saint John's University, Collegeville, Minnesota wrote this powerful hymn which we will sing at worship this Sunday. I find the words of this hymn refreshing as we move toward the end of summer and turn the calendar to September.

The autumn season continues the latter part of our Pentecost season (called "ordinary time) in the cycle of the church year. Our Sunday worship gospel texts from Luke narrate the ministry of Jesus as He teaches and tells parables. Readings from Philemon and Paul's letters to Timothy encourage faithful living in Jesus Christ. Autumn also invites a renewal within the congregation. We resume faith formation activities after summer break and a sense of busy-ness returns to the parish. As the year turns, we have a rush of energy and excitement for all the possibilities.

With this hustle and bustle of the fall with all its competing activities, we are called to remain focused on the presence of Christ in daily lives. Our mission is literally "to be Christ's presence" in our communities, families, workplace, schools, and world. As Paul urges in his second letter to Timothy, we are to "proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching" (2 Tim. 4:2)

Our September schedule at St. John's brings forth worship, fellowship, faith formation, group, and service opportunities. It is a great time to share encouragement of one another and learning together. We also will hear more about our *IMAGINE* campaign building projects at a special Congregation Informational meeting on Wednesday, September 17 at 6pm.

During this season, I pray that we all will seek our opportunities to live out God's grace and compassion as we also learn more about God's ongoing presence in our world.

Building upon our new Creation Care series, church youth of all ages will be learning about *Fresh Waters* in September. Lunch will be provided for each group.



The story ends in utter devastation, as the remaining people of the dwindling southern kingdom of Judah are carried off to Babylon in exile. There are a few bright spots along the way—the prophetic ministry of Elijah/Elisha.

The question at the center of this book is: Will God's promised Messiah come to rescue Israel in spite of their failures?

Come out and learn more about this important time in Israel's history!

Confirmation Ministries at St John's Sunday, starting September 14 at 10am



Confirmation classes will begin/resume for Middle Schoolers on **Sunday, September 14** in the Confirmation classroom above Pastor's office from 10:00-10:50 am. Taught by Mark McLean, the

main goal is "for our youth to gain a better understanding of the Christian faith and their relationship with Jesus.

In their study time on Sunday mornings, time will be spent on some of the wonderful stories in the Old Testament, a detailed look into one of the Gospels, the Sacraments, the Apostles' Creed, the Ten Commandments, and the Lord's Prayer. Luther's Small Catechism will be thoroughly discussed. The life and times of Martin Luther, the Reformation, and what it means to be a Lutheran! Confirmation at St. John's is a three-year program.

Additionally, youth are asked to participate in a week-long Confirmation Camp for a week in the summer with Pastor Rachel at Lutheridge Camp in Arden, North Carolina. # **Lutheridge Mission Trip**

IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO JOIN ST. JOHN'S LUTHERIDGE MISSION TRIP TEAM...even though it's too late to cancel your existing reservation, it's not too late to join us! We can add you to our team- a few beds are

still available at the Bacot lodging location. The cost is \$157.51 per person/per week Sunday-Friday. Food is provided by our amazing food team (I saw the menu- it's going to be GOOD food)

The dates are Sunday, 9/28 (we leave the church at 1pm-3pm checkin) through Friday 10/3 (11am check-out). Bacot with 9 bedrooms/20 available beds on 2 levels with 4 bathrooms. Overflow lodging would be in Thornburg. At Bacot we will have dining and cooking facilities available so we will be able to prepare/serve our own meals. There are common/meeting areas and outside porches for gathering. If necessary, St. John's can provide financial assistance on a case by case basis.



Work projects will include clearing trails of debris, replacing split rail fencing, some construction and cabin cleaning. All the work will be on the Lutheridge campus. As we get closer to the date we will have a more accurate idea of the jobs needed.
