

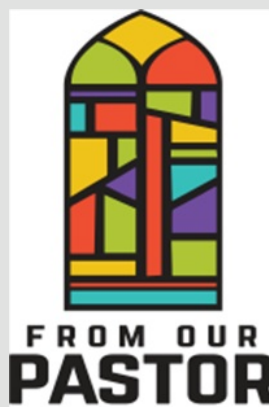

Dear Friends:

This Sunday we come to the pinnacle and last Sunday of our Epiphany season, and we are invited to go to the mountaintop with Jesus. It has been a lengthy season of light and revelation that began with Jesus' baptism and first miracles and moved through his calling of the first disciples. We have been encouraged and provoked by the gospel messages of Jesus to see more clearly his identity and mission as the Son of God sent to bring forth the kingdom of God for the sake of the world.

## Music Notes

### Organist/Choir Update

#### Update on Organist/Choir Director and Choir Practice

We are blessed at St. John's to have members of our congregation with musical gifts. In consultation with the Congregation Council, we have made agreements with Deb Blackmore and Grace Lichtenwald to help us out over the next few months while we assess our Musical Leadership needs, begin a search process, and hire new staff.

#### Deb Blackmore - Guest Choir Director

Deb has been a member at St. John's for around 17 years. In addition to having a career as a School Psychologist in the public schools, Deb served as an Organist and Choir Director in several Lutheran churches in South Carolina. She holds a music degree from Newberry College. In her earlier years at St. John's, Deb was a member of the Adult Chancel Choir, and was supply organist. In more recent years, Deb has been a member of the Bell Choir and currently is a part of the Survivors group. Additionally, she served many years on the



council, served as an office volunteer, and as a member and chair of the Preschool Board.

### **Grace Lichtenwald - Supply Organist**

Grace joined St John's in 2018. In the fall of 2020 and our Covid lockdown, she began playing the flute at Biggerstaff worship with our Praise band. When we returned to the sanctuary, Grace became our interim organist for twenty months--prior to that it had been more than 40 years since she had served as an organist and she felt blessed to have returned to this musical calling. In her earlier life in New York, Grace studied at the Guilman Organ School and served as Organist and Choir director in several Lutheran churches before going to work for the phone company for 30 years. She served St. Matthias in Easley as an interim organist/choir director. In other areas of the church, Grace is involved with our Chefs program and Survivors group.

### MEALS WE PACKAGED ARE HEADED TO UKRAINE!

Located in eastern Europe, Ukraine is the second largest country on the continent. The conflict in Ukraine has caused one of the fastest forced population movements since World War II - millions of people have left the country or are internally displaced. As food production and supplies are disrupted by the conflict, many people do not have reliable access to sufficient nutritious food.

Through Rise Against Hunger's Responding to Emergencies pathway, to address threats to food and nutrition security in times of crisis, they collaborate with organizations that are meeting the immediate needs of families and communities in this region. The meals we packaged can help serve internally displaced people, refugees, and communities facing loss of access to resources that support their livelihoods. We are helping to meet the nutritional needs of these people at a critical moment.

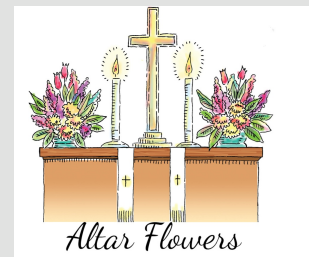

St. John's volunteers prepare and deliver over 1000 meals per year - this has become an amazing outreach. Many thanks to the 30 volunteer drivers who deliver each week- without them we could not do our work. On the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Thursdays, our established Chefs ministry prepares and delivers meals. On the 4th, and 5th Thursdays, we have partnered with the culinary arts students at the Hamilton Career Center. The students, under the direction of Rodney Quick, have been preparing the meals. This is a win-win ministry- we are supporting the students and they are helping us. In the words of Mr. Quick "the teaching tool of learning to give back is priceless".

I speak for myself, our volunteers, and our recipients when I say thank you to all involved for your continuing support of this ministry. As with all our ministries and outreach opportunities there is a turn-over of volunteers.
