Gwinnett County is initiating the development of the FFY 2023 Annual Action Plan, which will contain specific projects and activities when approved for FFY 2023 HUD grant funding by the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners in November of 2022.

One important step in the preparation of the FFY 2023 Annual Action Plan is the assessment of needs. Gwinnett County is holding a virtual Needs Assessment Public Hearing to receive citizen input on community development, housing, and homeless needs which might be addressed utilizing FFY 2023 grant funding from HUD. The information gathered from citizens will be used to address needs identified in the Consolidated Plan 2020-2024 and to be included in FFY 2023 Annual Action Plan. A summary of public comments received will be provided to the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners prior to their approval of the proposed FFY 2023 Annual Action Plan and the summary of public comments will be included in the submission to HUD.
