

H.E.R.O. Navigator Initiative

Connecting with families experiencing homelessness is a new initiative for Belmont UMC outreach. The team, led by Gretchen Napier, is collaborating with H.E.R.O of Metro Nashville Schools. This initiative will help families experiencing homelessness to access critical community services. Navigators (Belmont UMC volunteers) will assist families as they get helpful information about jobs, transportation, documents, and so much more.

On four different evenings in September and October (9/13, 9/27, 10/11, 10/25), at Buena Vista School, we'll welcome 10-15 families. We'll share a meal; then navigators and parents will have access to over 15 agencies and services that are life changing and life saving. Childcare will be available.
