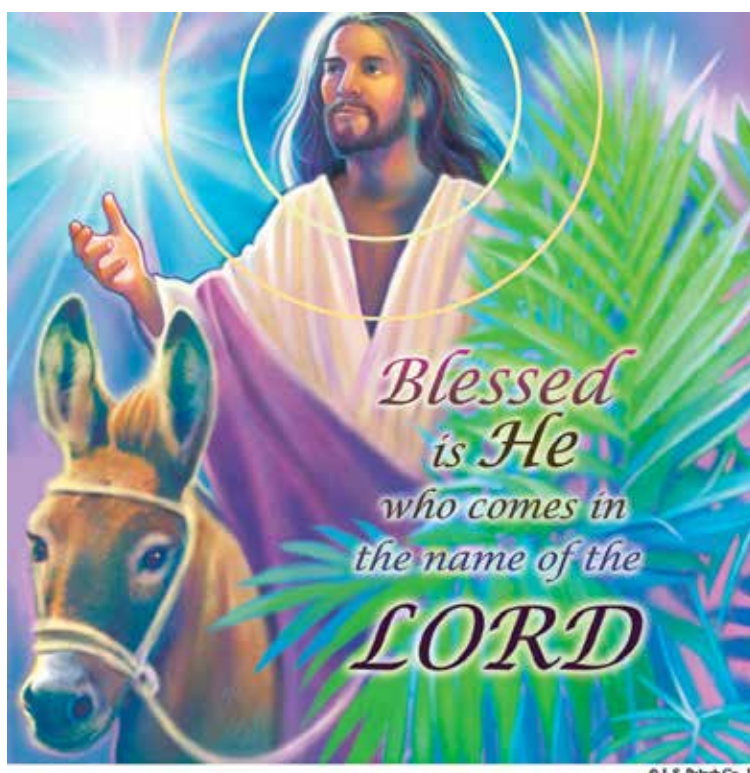

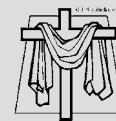

Reservation Information

- Reservations for registered parishioners will be required for all services and will be taken by phone **Monday, March 29, through Thursday, April 1 (9:00 am-5:00 pm).**
- First come, first served. Once the reservation list is full a waitlist of 10 spaces will be taken. **Please do not call the Pastoral Office prior to March 29.** DO NOT leave a message.
- Registered parishioners of St. Luke Church will be given priority. A separate reservation should be made for each service you wish to attend.
- Reservations cannot be made for a non-family member.
- Please cancel if you decide NOT to attend any service to allow for those on the waitlist.
- Check in will be at the church front doors. See p. 3 for other COVID safety reminders.
- All services will be conducted following the latest liturgical guidelines published by the Archdiocese. The Mass of the Lord's Supper will NOT have the procession of oils, foot washing or adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.
- Good Friday service will be concise and will NOT have the usual veneration of the Cross. Holy Saturday Vigil will be closed to parishioners for safety reasons and reserved for those who are receiving the sacraments and their guests.

COVID-19 PHASED REOPENING STATUS

- 9:00 am Daily Mass indoors has resumed. No reservations needed. Mandatory facial covering and social distancing.
 - Sunday 6:30 am, 8:30 am and 10:30 am Masses have resumed indoors. No reservations needed. Mandatory facial covering and social distancing. Only families or single households should sit together. Please be prompt in arriving; Doors will be closed when safe capacity is reached.
- The **10:30 am Sunday Mass is now live streamed**. The Mass is available to view on the St. Luke Church website (www.stluketemplecity.org), on the St. Luke Church Vimeo webpage (<https://vimeo.com/stluketemplecity>), and the St. Luke Catholic School Facebook page (St. Luke Catholic School Temple City). If you are unable to join us live at 10:30 am on Sundays, the live stream can be replayed.
- A Drive-thru Communion Reception is offered 12:00-12:30 pm on Sundays. Please do not pull into lot early until mass participants have departed. Line up going south on Cloverly Avenue by car and turn into the church parking lot. PLEASE DO NOT PARK. We will stand and distribute communion to people in the car in the hand. Please wear a mask as we approach your car. Drive off safely through exit on Broadway.

Ongoing:

- Drive-thru Confessions are held on Saturdays at 1:00 pm, weather permitting. Please wear a mask and drive through the church parking lot where you will be directed through the back alley to approach one of the priests who will hear your brief confession from outside the passenger side of the car. If there are multiple people in the car, the passenger/s may exit and stand at a safe distance and we will come to them after hearing the driver's confession. Drive out safely the rear gate onto Live Oak Avenue.

Reminder: *Confessions will not be held on April 3 or 10.*

- For anointing of the sick, please call the Pastoral Office. Priests are NOT allowed into hospitals, convalescent hospitals, etc.
- Gravesides only for the near future. Memorials may be planned later. Mortuaries/cemeteries are backed up for at least two months.
- Pastoral Office remains open for business, phone and e-mail, or arranged drop-off or pick-up only. Items can left in office mailbox.
- School remains open through waiver for approved attendance.
- For other sacramental arrangements, please call the Pastoral Office.
- Eucharistic Ministers should not visit the sick.
- Groups or ministry meetings are not permitted to meet on campus until at least late Summer or early Fall. Please do not meet off campus.

***The Archbishop continues to give dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass until further notice.
Please do not attend in-person Mass if you are sick or otherwise uncomfortable coming indoors.***

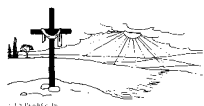

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord



Reading I

Is 50:4-7

The Lord GOD has given me a well-trained tongue, that I might know how to speak to the weary a word that will rouse them. Morning after morning he opens my ear that I may hear; and I have not rebelled, have not turned back.

I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame.

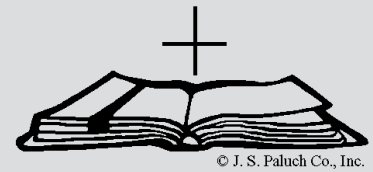

It may be Palm Sunday, but the Passion is far more prominent in today's liturgy, which invites us to follow Jesus from his triumphant entrance into Jerusalem to his crucifixion and burial. It simply overflows with the sorrow and intimacy that will be dominant themes in Holy Week.

The first reading from the book of Isaiah gives voice to the suffering of an innocent person—perhaps a prophet—or the people as a whole. The refrain for the Psalm is Jesus' cry from the cross (Mark 13:14), a cry of absolute, existential loneliness. The great kenotic (emptying) hymn in Philippians provides a stunning portrait of Jesus' ultimate emptying, simultaneously intimate and cosmological.

INTIMACY

All four Gospels have a Passion narrative. While there is agreement on the main events—an intimate meal shared by Jesus and the disciples, betrayal by Judas, prayer in Gethsemane followed by Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion—each Gospel has unique variations that give it a particular meaning or tone. In today's Gospel from Mark, Jesus is anointed by an unnamed

woman in the house of Simon the leper. All the Gospels have Jesus being anointed by a woman, but only Mark puts this scene just before the Last Supper. Jesus says the anointing is preparation for his burial; it is as if the woman could see a prophet's suffering in Jesus' life and feel it in his presence. Moved by compassion, she empties her jar of expensive nard on his head, pouring out her love in a profoundly intimate act. Perhaps she will also join the women who witness the crucifixion from afar (Mark 15:40-41), after the Twelve seem to be long gone.

Palm Sunday invites us to follow Jesus through the rest of Holy Week. By moving us to feel the injustice and the suffering endured by Jesus, this week's liturgies and devotions present us with those same choices. Perhaps, like the unnamed woman, we can open ourselves to others' suffering and respond with love and compassion. Or perhaps, like the Twelve, we will be conspicuous by our absence.
