Scripture Reflection

“BUT WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM?”

“YOU ARE THE CHRIST.”

We live in a time when people are looking at polls, ratings, and stars – approval ratings, A or B ratings for restaurants, and how many stars does it have on Yelp or what were the reviews of customers. Jesus was not after people's approval of him when He asked His disciples – *who do people say that I am?*

Because Jesus is God, He knew exactly what is in the mind of people and what they think of Him. Jesus' question to the disciples about who the people think He is could be considered as a set-up question. He wanted to show to His disciples the difference between people's opinion or superficial knowledge of Him versus His disciples' personal knowledge of Him based on their experiences of living with Him.

Because they spent time with the Lord every day of His public ministry, He wanted to know how well they know Him. *“But you, who do you say that I am?”* People's opinion of Jesus was based on the popular knowledge of prophets. It is an external knowledge that although not necessarily false, is never adequate. They interpret Jesus in terms of the past, in terms of the predictable, and the possible, not in terms of Himself, or His uniqueness, which cannot be assigned to any other category. People's knowledge of the Lord Jesus was superficial; He was just another wonder worker for them.


Contrary to the public knowledge of Jesus, the disciples' recognition of Jesus as the Christ was an acknowledgment and confession based on their everyday experience of living with Him. They have seen His miracles and healings. They have witnessed His interior life - His prayer life, His character and His personality. They have come to believe and were convinced that He is truly the Messiah. Unfortunately, the disciples' concept of His Messiahship was limited to the idea of a political leader and liberator from foreign rule.


St. Mark in his presentation of this event wrote that Jesus asked them those questions “along the way.” This phrase signifies that they were on the way to Jerusalem, where Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection would take place. As soon as Peter made his confession, Jesus predicted for the first time His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. And then He followed up with the conditions of discipleship.

Today similar opinions are clearly held by the “people” who have somehow or other come to know Christ, who have perhaps even made a scholarly study of Him but have not encountered Jesus Himself in His utter uniqueness and otherness. Today it is fashionable to regard Jesus as one of the great religious founders who were granted a profound experience of God. They can thus speak of God to other people who have been denied this “religious disposition,” as it were, drawing them into their own experience of God. We are still dealing here with a human experience of God that reflects His infinite reality in the finitude and limitation of the human spirit.

The saints, like Our Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, the apostles, St. John Paul II, Mother Teresa and Padre Pio, who had a deeper knowledge and personal relationship with Christ, unite themselves to Him on the Cross. They lived the “Paschal Mystery – Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection” each day. Their prayer life, their sacrifices, and their heroic virtues do not just teach us about holiness but rather reveal to us that they truly know who Jesus is. *To know Jesus for who He truly is and to live in a manner that shows that He lives in us is our common goal and calling – our universal call to holiness.*

The Gospel reminds us that our recognition of Jesus as the Christ, our acceptance of His Lordship, and our discipleship require from us our daily denial of ourselves and taking up our crosses each day. That is how we profess not just with words but with actions and with our life that Jesus is Our Lord, and that we are His “Paschal People.” *-Fr. Robert*



LIFE, JUSTICE AND PEACE SPOTLIGHT



Helping to End the Injustice of Abortion - *September 22 to October 31*

40 Days for Life is an internationally coordinated **40-day campaign that aims to end abortion** locally. Twice a year, **40 Days for Life** (<https://40daysforlife.com/>) uses a peaceful approach of prayer and fasting, community outreach, and peaceful all-day vigils in front of abortion businesses to change hearts and minds. Nationwide and beyond, the campaign has witnessed **19,198** babies saved, **221** abortion workers quit and **112** abortion centers closed and many repented victims.

The crisis of abortion is enormous. A tragedy of epidemic proportions, abortion is the leading cause of death in the world, taking an estimated 40 million innocent lives every year. And equally tragic is the number of people who endorse and support abortion. This sobering news should move us to pray, fast and take action.

The defense of the unborn is ultimately a spiritual battle. The devil does so much to try to distract us away from the One we serve -- Jesus Christ. Christ told us some demons can only be driven out by prayer and fasting. These two go hand in hand. Prayer keeps us rooted in the fact that it is our desire to carry out God's will. Fasting is a sacrifice that helps us reach beyond our own limitations with God's help. Knowing that "with God, all things are possible," people of faith and conscience unite in 40 days of prayer and fasting.

Please consider participating in our local **40 Days for Life campaign** starting on September 22. We invite you to join with others from St. Luke and neighboring parishes to peacefully pray (wearing a mask and socially distanced) in the public right-of-way outside Planned Parenthood El Monte, at **4786 N. Peck Road, El Monte** (corner of Peck and Lower Azusa) between the hours of 7:00 am and 7:00 pm during the 40-day vigil. If you hesitate to pray in front of Planned Parenthood because you think you will be approached by people or expected to do sidewalk counseling, rest assured that at this location you will not talk with anyone. You only stand or sit, and pray.

SUFFERING, HOPE AND LOVE

Our readings from Isaiah and from the Gospel of Mark confront us with the fact that the invitation to faith leads us into suffering. In Isaiah, the prophet accepts pain and shaming from others, as he trusts in God. In Mark, Jesus is blunt about this: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." When we embrace faith, we are confronted with our own fears about suffering and about losing comfort, status, and control over our lives. Life has plenty of suffering already, so why choose to add to it? Jesus points to a response: avoiding our fears and clinging to illusion and superficial comforts will not give us what we really want from life. Jesus offers a better, deeper life, a life grounded in God's love. It is lived in hope of resurrection and the final triumph of this love.

A DIFFERENT LIFE

The Gospel of Mark reaches a turning point in today's passage. About halfway through Mark, Jesus' disciples begin to understand Jesus as the Messiah (or Christ). And Jesus begins to spell out just what is expected of those who follow him. The story then shifts to learning just what being Christ, and following Christ, actually means. Jesus shatters the expectation of a political or military power defeating Israel's oppressors, and reveals a different kind of Messiah. The disciples later come to see that this different Messiah offers a different understanding of power, and of life itself.

We inhabit a world that honors power over others, through wealth or achievement or violence. Jesus invites us into a community and a way of life that honors the power of love and service to others. Lived fully, it is truly a different way of life. It is marked by great suffering and great joy, because it embraces the fundamental pattern of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

A "LARGE" FAITH

The letter of James is designed to enlarge your faith. James knew that his community faced trials that could lead them to abandon the faith, or perhaps to reduce faith to a comfortable, manageable size. In today's passage, James calls the reader to resist reducing faith to safe, intellectual assent to teachings, and instead to expand one's faith to actively engage in good works, especially in service to the poor.

To have a "large" faith is to move from apathy toward others' sufferings to empathy and to action. A large faith leads to a large heart, where we can take in the enormity of suffering in the world around us, not become overwhelmed by it, and do what we can to relieve it. With a large heart, we can even squarely face our own sufferings, accepting our own tragedies with forgiveness and hope, and walking in empathy with all who share in suffering. © J. S. 
