

Scripture Reflection

Though we re-enter Ordinary Time already knowing that Jesus is the Son of God (see the centurion's words at the end of the Palm Sunday Passion reading from Mark's Gospel), the long succession of Sundays confronts us again with the question that each Christian community, each individual Christian faces continually throughout life: "Who is this?" (Mark 4:41), and prompts an "examination of conscience" regarding the practical consequences of our response.

This year's Gospel readings from Mark suggest that we find our answer in the cross and in the Eucharist. Today's stark challenge of Jesus' call to discipleship is, thankfully, balanced by the comfort we can take in relating—perhaps only too well—to the disciples' fears.

Though we welcome Jesus in Word and Eucharist Sunday after Sunday, don't we all, from time to time during our lives' "ordinary time," experience Jesus' "real absence"?

PARISH REOPENING UPDATES

Updates as of June 17, 2021

- For those who are vaccinated, masks and physical distancing are no longer required on parish property for Mass, in the Adoration Chapel, during Drive-thru Confessions, or visiting the Pastoral Office. Masks will continue to be required for those who are unvaccinated and cannot physically distance from those not in your household.

We ask that everyone respects the comfortability and vulnerabilities of our fellow parishioners as we transition out of the Pandemic and respect their decisions to continue mask wearing and distancing.

- Music Issues and Missalettes will return to the church pews and not to be taken home, but shared at liturgies (*It is not necessary to return the old missalettes you may have; please recycle or save for when the recycling bin is on the church property July 9-11.*).
- Liturgical singing is allowed.
- The choir loft is not available for seating at this time.
- The 10:30 am Sunday Mass will continue to be live streamed for now. The Mass is available to view on the St. Luke Church website (www.stluketemplecity.org), on the St. Luke Church Vimeo webpage (<https://vimeo.com/stluketemplecity>), and the St. Luke Catholic School Facebook page (St. Luke Catholic School Temple City). The live stream can be replayed.
- The Adoration Chapel (located in the Pastoral Office) will reopen on Monday, June 21. Hours: Monday/Wednesday/Friday: 8:00 am-1:30 pm and 2:30-4:30 pm. Tuesday and Thursday: 8:00 am-4:30 pm.
- For now, all employees and volunteers are required to wear masks during liturgies, which means that as you see priests and ministers following protocol, it is due to Archdiocesan policy and CalOSHA standards which we are mandated to comply to.
- Reminder! The Drive-thru Communion Reception Line has been discontinued.

Ongoing:

- Drive-thru Confessions are held outdoors on Saturdays at 10:00 am, weather permitting. Drive through the church parking lot where you will be directed through the back alley to approach one of the priests who will hear your brief confession from outside the passenger side of the car. If there are multiple people in the car, the passenger/s may exit and stand at a safe distance and we will come to them after hearing the driver's confession. Drive out safely the rear gate onto Live Oak Avenue.
- The Parish Office is open to the public Monday-Friday, 8:00 am-5:00 pm (Closed for lunch 1:30-2:30 pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.). Items can also be left in office mailbox.
- For anointing of the sick and other sacramental arrangements, please call the Pastoral Office.
- Groups/ministry meetings are not allowed to meet on campus. Please do not meet off campus.

Archbishop Gomez will rescind the dispensation for attending Mass this coming weekend (June 19th).

Those with vulnerabilities or underlying conditions may wish to stay home. Please do not attend Mass if you are sick or not feeling well.

We are respectful of this unique transitional period where our future pastor will need to discern how he wishes to interpret the guidelines of the Archdiocese, and thus, we will wait for further correspondence and decision making on his part.

Thank you for your patience and understanding during this challenging time. Subject to change at any time.



Sunday Readings

The Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I

Jb 38:1, 8-11

The Lord addressed Job out of the storm and said: Who shut within doors the sea, when it burst forth from the womb; when I made the clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling bands?

When I set limits for it and fastened the bar of its door, and said: Thus far shall you come but no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stilled!

Response: *The Word of the Lord.*

Responsorial Psalm

107:23-24, 25-26, 28-29, 30-31

Response: *(1b) Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting.*

They who sailed the sea in ships, trading on the deep waters. These saw the works of the LORD and his wonders in the abyss.

Consequently, from now on we regard no one according to the flesh; even if we once knew Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know him so no longer. So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come.

They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm.

Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" They were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

LIFE, JUSTICE AND PEACE SPOTLIGHT

The Vocation of Fatherhood

Fatherhood is a vocation of love. It is to be God's own representative on earth and to give life to, nurture, and raise the next generation in the faith. Like St. Joseph, men are called to be the guardians and protectors of their families and to keep them away from those who would harm them. Fathers today must take seriously their obligation to defend their children's innocence. This was the focus of a recent meeting of The National Faith Coalition Against Human Trafficking. Discussion focused on the critical role men play in preventing human trafficking. Much of today's music, popular shows, and video games contain explicit and otherwise objectionable content. Children are in effect being groomed and desensitized by exposure to this, which makes them more vulnerable to predators either in person or, more often, online.

We may not hear much about it, but this problem has hit close to home for us, too. In 2017 three girls aged 14 to 17 years old were rescued from an alleged child sex trafficking ring at a motel on Las Tunas Drive in San Gabriel. In 2018, several women were recovered after being forced into commercial sex work by a resident of San Gabriel who owned four massage businesses in the surrounding communities. In another case, a 16-year-old girl was rescued from sex traffickers in Pomona.

Sadly, estimates are that over 400,000 people are living in slavery in the United States today and an estimated 40 million men, women, and children are slaves worldwide. Pope Francis said in a 2014 message, "It is not possible to remain indifferent before the knowledge that human beings are bought and sold like goods. I think of the adoption of children for the extraction of their organs, of women deceived and forced to prostitute themselves, of workers exploited and denied their rights or a voice, and so on. This is human trafficking!"

The Faith Coalition's goal is to mobilize people of all faiths to join forces to end human trafficking. "Given that over 51% of people in the United States attend a faith community, if enough of us took effective action, we could end human trafficking."

Dear St. Joseph, on this Father's Day, please intercede for us. Ask God to bless and inspire all fathers to be faithful and courageous protectors of those he has entrusted to their care.


