

COVID-19 PHASED REOPENING STATUS

Important Reminders from the Pastor as of January 31, 2021

Beginning Monday, February 1:


- 9:00 am Daily Mass indoors to resume. No reservations needed. Mandatory facial covering and social distancing will be enforced.

Beginning Sunday, February 7:

- Sunday 8:30 am and 10:30 am Masses to resume indoors. No reservations needed. Mandatory facial covering and social distancing. Only families or single households should sit together. Doors will be closed when safe capacity is reached.
- Drive-thru Communion Reception will move to Noon on Sundays to accommodate mass parking and departure. Please do not pull into lot early until mass participants have departed. *See below for more details.*
- Sunday Virtual Mass will continue to be available online.

Ongoing:

- Drive-thru Confessions continue to be held on Saturdays at 1:00 pm, weather permitting. *See below for more details.*
- For anointing of the sick, please call the Pastoral Office. There are strict protocols in place for a priest to enter homes. Priests are NOT allowed into hospitals, convalescent hospitals, etc.
- Gravesides only for the near future. Memorials may be planned later. Mortuaries/cemeteries are backed up for at least two months.
- Pastoral Office remains open for business, phone and e-mail, or arranged drop-off or pick-up only. Items can left in office mailbox; it's checked regularly.
- School remains open through waiver for approved attendance.
- For other sacramental arrangements, please call the Pastoral Office.
- Eucharistic Ministers should not visit the sick.
- Groups or ministry meetings are not permitted to meet on campus until at least late Summer or early Fall. Please do not meet off campus.

Finally, any aspect of this reopening can change at any time in accordance with ADLA guidelines and the orders of the health officials. If we were to have three cases of people testing COVID Positive, we could be shut down once again for quarantine. We have had a few cases already, so let us continue to proceed supporting our community efforts rather than any negative options. ***We continue the journey...***

‘Drive-thru’ Communion Reception Line


A “drive thru” communion line is offered each Sunday from 10:00-10:45 am (*Moves to Noon on February 7.*). Please line up going south on Cloverly Avenue by car and turn into the church parking lot. PLEASE DO NOT PARK. We will stand and distribute communion to people in the car in the hand. Please wear a mask as we approach your car. Drive off safely through exit on Broadway.

‘Drive-thru’ Confessions

‘Drive-thru’ Confessions are offered at 1:00 pm on Saturdays. Please wear a mask and drive through the church parking lot where you will be directed through the back alley to approach one of the priests who will hear your brief confession from outside the passenger side of the car.

If there are multiple people in the car, the passenger/s may exit and stand at a safe distance and we will come to them after hearing the driver’s confession. This is not a prolonged counseling moment: we want anybody who wants a brief confession following these months of lockdown to have the opportunity, so please be prepared and expedient. Drive out safely the rear gate onto Live Oak Avenue. *Confessions may be cancelled on inclement weather days.*

Reading I

Dt 18:15-20

Moses spoke to all the people, saying: "A prophet like me will the LORD, your God, raise up for you from among your own kin; to him you shall listen.

This is exactly what you requested of the LORD, your God, at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, 'Let us not again hear the voice of the LORD, our God, nor see this great fire any more, lest we die.'

And the LORD said to me, 'This was well said. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him.

Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it. But if a prophet presumes to speak in my name an oracle that I have not commanded him to speak, or speaks in the name of other gods, he shall die."

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes.

In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?

Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!"

The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this?

A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.



January 31, 2021 **FOURTH Sunday
in ORDINARY TIME**

Uniquely in the Gospel of Mark, Jesus' public ministry begins with a direct confrontation with an unclean spirit. Today's Gospel passage reflects a recurring theme in Mark, that Jesus' coming is part of a cosmic battle between God and evil forces. It was commonly believed that many spirits were present in the world, and some sought to control human beings. Mark asserts that in Jesus, God has come to rescue humanity, to free us from every form of bondage.

In today's passage, the unclean spirit does not surrender power quietly. After complaints, convulsions, and screams, the spirit finally departs. As we may witness in own experience, that which binds us—fear, injustice, resentment—often departs only after a mighty struggle. Confronting anything "unclean" in our hearts, our institutions, or our society often involves a long journey toward freedom. May we sustain our efforts and our trust in God, during these long struggles.

Moses assures Israel of God's continued presence by promising a new prophet. Like Moses, the prophet will be

DID YOU KNOW...

Do you know what to do if someone is choking?

Choking is one of the leading causes of accidental death, but many people do not know what to do if someone is choking near them. If a person is coughing, grabbing his or her throat, or passed out with no explanation, he/she could be choking. Utilizing abdominal thrusts, also known as the Heimlich maneuver, could prevent suffocation.

Parents should be knowledgeable as to how to perform this maneuver, and if possible, should attend a CPR training course so they are prepared, in the event that a child or adult is choking.

raised up directly by God. But how to distinguish a true prophet from a false one? Many claim to speak for God. The task is complicated by the fact that often, true prophets make waves, cause trouble, and disturb how things are normally done. Many simply don't want to hear what God is saying, because it threatens their privilege, comfort, or sense of identity.

Like the Israelites in today's reading, it can be hard for us to bear the voice of God. For God calls us out of all the ways we avoid opening our hearts to God and to others. And so, God raises up surprise prophets in daily life. These are all the people and events who summon us to fuller maturity in love and in faith. We are called upon to always be ready for the prophetic word that may emerge from God's surprises.




