

Scripture Reflection

Who's More Generous?

Does the Christian duty to help the poor seem to be overwhelming? We hear more and more about the homeless and jobless. Even in St. Paul's time there was more than enough poverty to go around. He was trying to build interest (in our second reading) in a project to help the Christians in Jerusalem. We see two of his reasons here.

First he tells what fine Christians they are, and hopes that they will be just as good in giving to his collection. Paul is challenging them to continue to show their love for God in their support for fellow Christians. The second reason was to show a good example: By helping the church in Jerusalem, they would show that Christians were united in faith and love for each other.

The main example he uses is Jesus, who made himself poor (i.e., human) so that we could be rich in grace and forgiveness. Paul challenges them, and us, to follow that example in giving from our wealth so that others can survive. Note that he doesn't expect them to live in poverty, just to share what they have out of love for Christ.

Today, we can ask ourselves, "Do I give to the poor because I feel guilty about all that I have? Or do I want to show my love for Jesus when I see him in the poor?" By looking at why we give to charities, we may find ourselves being even more generous than we expected. (c) J. S. Paluch Co.

PARISH REOPENING UPDATES

Updates as of June 17, 2021

- For those who are vaccinated, masks and physical distancing are no longer required on parish property for Mass, in the Adoration Chapel, during Drive-thru Confessions, or visiting the Pastoral Office. Masks will continue to be required for those who are unvaccinated and cannot physically distance from those not in your household.

We ask that everyone respects the comfortability and vulnerabilities of our fellow parishioners as we transition out of the Pandemic and respect their decisions to continue mask wearing and distancing.

- Music Issues and Missalettes will return to the church pews and not to be taken home, but shared at liturgies (*It is not necessary to return the old missalettes you may have; please recycle or save for when the recycling bin is on the church property July 9-11.*).
- Liturgical singing is allowed.
- The choir loft is not available for seating at this time.
- The 10:30 am Sunday Mass will continue to be live streamed for now. The Mass is available to view on the St. Luke Church website (www.stluketemplecity.org), on the St. Luke Church Vimeo webpage (<https://vimeo.com/stluketemplecity>), and the St. Luke Catholic School Facebook page (St. Luke Catholic School Temple City). The live stream can be replayed.
- The Adoration Chapel (located in the Pastoral Office) will reopen on Monday, June 21. Hours: Monday/Wednesday/Friday: 8:00 am-1:30 pm and 2:30-4:30 pm. Tuesday and Thursday: 8:00 am-4:30 pm.
- For now, all employees and volunteers are required to wear masks during liturgies, which means that as you see priests and ministers following protocol, it is due to Archdiocesan policy and CalOSHA standards which we are mandated to comply to.
- Reminder! The Drive-thru Communion Reception Line has been discontinued.

Ongoing:

- Drive-thru Confessions are held outdoors on Saturdays at 10:00 am, weather permitting. Drive through the church parking lot where you will be directed through the back alley to approach one of the priests who will hear your brief confession from outside the passenger side of the car. If there are multiple people in the car, the passenger/s may exit and stand at a safe distance and we will come to them after hearing the driver's confession. Drive out safely the rear gate onto Live Oak Avenue.
- The Parish Office is open to the public Monday-Friday, 8:00 am-5:00 pm (Closed for lunch 1:30-2:30 pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.). Items can also be left in office mailbox.
- For anointing of the sick and other sacramental arrangements, please call the Pastoral Office.
- Groups/ministry meetings are not allowed to meet on campus. Please do not meet off campus.

Archbishop Gomez will rescind the dispensation for attending Mass this coming weekend (June 19th).

Those with vulnerabilities or underlying conditions may wish to stay home. Please do not attend Mass if you are sick or not feeling well.

We are respectful of this unique transitional period where our future pastor will need to discern how he wishes to interpret the guidelines of the Archdiocese, and thus, we will wait for further correspondence and decision making on his part.

Thank you for your patience and understanding during this challenging time. Subject to change at any time.

Reading I

Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24

God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living. For he fashioned all things that they might have being; and the creatures of the world are wholesome, and there is not a destructive drug among them nor any domain of the netherworld on earth, for justice is undying.

Mk 5:21-24, 35b-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live."

He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?"

Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James.

When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep."

And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!"

The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

Pregnant Mothers Need Support!

Women in difficult life situations who become pregnant are often scared, alone and do not know where to turn for help. According to 2014 data from abortion centers, 75% of their clients were poor, 60% were young women in their 20s and 86% were unmarried. Abortion often becomes their solution of choice because they do not know that help is available to them or that other resources exist.

"No woman should ever face a pregnancy feeling alone, or desperate, or like she has no other options. These are our sisters. We cannot be indifferent to their fears. We need to be near to them, to help them in every way that we can." ~Archbishop José H. Gomez

There are local resources for pregnant women and their families who need help with crisis pregnancies.

Pregnancy Help Center of San Gabriel Valley, Inc. is located at 909-904 E. Main Street, Alhambra, CA 91801. Their appointment phone line is (626) 309-0788 and their website is <https://pregnancyhelpsgv.com/>. Their services include free pregnancy tests and non-diagnostic ultrasounds with audio and visual, professional staff of RNs, ultrasound technician and doctors, 24-Hour Helpline, sensitive options counseling, referrals, baby supplies and parenting classes.

Guadalupe Pregnancy Services promotes healthy alternatives to abortion through counseling and education. Their services include free pregnancy tests, information on pregnancy options, ultrasound referrals, adoption referrals, parenting classes, relationship mentoring and maternity clothes, baby clothes and baby essentials. Options United is an agency that refers women to all the pregnancy resource centers in Southern California. 
