Scripture Reflection

Jesus Christ is Lord!

In the Gospel we hear the Lord Jesus predicted once again that He would be handed over to men, they would kill Him, and after three days, He would rise. The disciples did not understand what He was saying, and they were afraid to ask Him any questions. In the Gospel of St. Mark, one of his Gospel themes is to show the failure of the disciples to accept the theology of the Crucified Jesus.

Instead of showing empathy and support to Our Lord, they were discussing who was the greatest among them. How insensitive and clueless the disciples were to the Lord and His mission. They were more concerned about who was the greatest among them. Their understanding of the Kingdom of God was just another political and economic setup. Possibly after hearing the Lord appointing Peter as the rock on which He would build His Church at Caesarea Philippi and perhaps also the fact that Peter, James, and John were chosen as witnesses to the Transfiguration caused a lot of resentment among the disciples. In any case, they quarreled among themselves as they always did whenever Jesus unveiled the Cross.

But Jesus knew what was in their hearts; and so, when they arrived at Capernaum probably in the house of Peter, Jesus asked them what they were arguing about along the way. They remained silent for they realized that they paid little attention to Him when He talked to them about His Passion and Death. Just like ordinary men, they were after power and wealth. Also, it remained a mystery to them that He who had healed many sick people and even raised the dead to life could ever submit Himself to a gruesome and shameful death. They realized that the Master read their thoughts and their own consciences accused them.


To correct their false ideas of superiority, Jesus said to them: *"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."* Then Jesus took a child, placed His arms around the child and presented the child to them as their model for greatness with these words, *"Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."*

The greatest of all His disciples would be those who would be like little children; for a child stands as a representative of God and His Divine Son upon the earth. The childlike spirit or qualities that He wanted to teach His disciples were humility, trust, and total dependence on God. Instead of pride, ambition, competition, a child demonstrates lowliness, contentment and surrender. There was a nobility in His Kingdom, but it was opposite to the rank of the world. In His Kingdom one rose by sinking; one increased by decreasing. He said that He came not to be served, but to serve. In His own Person, He was exemplifying humiliation as ascending to the depths of defeat of the Cross. Since they could not understand the Cross, He encouraged them to take as a model a little child whom He embraced to His heart.

The greatest are the least, and the least are the greatest. Honor and prestige are not to him who sits at the head of the table, but to him who girds himself with a towel and washes the feet of those who are his servants. He who is God became man; He who is Lord of heaven and earth humbled Himself to the Cross; this was the incomparable act of humility which they were to learn. If for the moment they could not learn it from Him, they were to learn it from a child, who is considered the "least" in the culture of Jesus' time.

St. Paul exhorts us to have this same attitude of Christ in his letter to the Philippians chapter 2: *"though He was in the form of God, He did not deem equality with God something to be grasped at. Rather, he emptied himself, and took the form of a slave being born in the likeness of men. He was known to be of human estate, and it was thus that He humbled Himself obediently accepting even death, even death on a cross. Because of this God highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name above every other name, so that at Jesus' name every knee must bend in the heavens, on the earth, and under the earth, and every tongue proclaim to the glory of God the Father: Jesus Christ is Lord!"*

Let us be inspired by the spiritual childhood of St. Therese of the Child Jesus: *"Because I was little and weak, Jesus stooped down to me and tenderly instructed me in the secrets of His Love."* (Story of a Soul, chapter 5) -Fr. Robert

Say the Word and my Soul shall be Healed



TWO PATHS

Today's first two readings present a striking contrast between two pathways in life. In Wisdom and the letter from James we are told of the path of the wicked, which leads to oppression and violence. We also hear of the path of the faithful, which leads to peace and human flourishing. Then our Gospel reading from Mark takes our reflection farther. The choice is shown to be not so simple or obvious.

The path of faithfulness means following Jesus' lead, to expand our circle of care toward everyone, especially the most vulnerable. This path also includes opening ourselves to suffering and trials, as we face resistance from within and from outside us. The two paths essentially diverge over whether we refuse or accept God's love. Each day we face such choices as God invites us into the divine circle of care and enlists us to extend our own circle to those around us.

WHO IS HONORED

Today's Gospel passage has two parts: Jesus' announcement again of his coming suffering and death, and a scene with the disciples arguing about who is the "greatest." Mark places these scenes next to each other to emphasize the disciples' failure to understand. Their petty argument was the opposite of what Jesus had described as the way to follow him. The disciples were following the common understanding of group status: to honor the influential and those who seem to contribute the most. Jesus points to the opposite: he honors the vulnerable, the "least" in the community; in this case, a child. And he honors those who welcome the child.

Mark was addressing his own community in the early Church, who were seeking to learn how to live their faith. His questions may be important for us too. Who is honored in our faith community, and why? How do we honor those whom we set as examples? Who benefits from this different kind of "greatness"?

ASK THE HARD QUESTIONS

Twice in today's Gospel, Jesus' disciples are reduced to silence. First when Jesus describes his future suffering and death, and again when caught in their argument about who is the greatest. Perhaps they were afraid to really understand his teachings because of what it might cost them. Maybe they were afraid of being seen as ignorant by Jesus and especially by each other. What if they had dared to admit their confusion and ignorance and asked Jesus hard questions? Would Jesus have welcomed them?

Jesus presents a child who is to be welcomed and embraced. The child sets an example: it is the child who knows that he or she doesn't know. The child is free to ask "childlike" questions, and is open to answers. What if, in the intimacy of our prayer, we asked Jesus our own hard, embarrassing questions: about life, about ourselves and our relationships, about God? How might our relationship with God then change? © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.


