

Scripture Reflection



Prepare the Way of the Lord, Make Straight His Paths

Last Sunday we began a new year in the church calendar with the season of Advent. Advent signifies our waiting and preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth on that first Christmas morning. Advent also reminds us that we are waiting for Jesus' Second Coming in glory when He will judge both the living and the dead as we profess in our Creed. To help us live the true spirit of Advent we encounter St. John the Baptist in the gospels of the Second and Third Sundays of Advent.

The way that St. Luke introduced St. John the Baptist as the forerunner of Christ was to set the stage by identifying the political and religious powers of his time. He named the political leaders - Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Philip, and Lysanias. He also named the high priests, the religious leaders - Annas and Caiaphas.

The word of God came to none of these powerful people but to a humble, "weird" man who dressed in camel's hair with a leather belt, and ate locust and wild honey in the barrenness of the desert — St. John the Baptist. His role was to prepare the hearts of God's people for the coming of the Messiah by proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Simply, his mission was to call people to conversion, to repent of their sins and to return to the Lord to be ready to accept Jesus as the Messiah when He arrives.

It is interesting to note why St. Luke mentioned the names of the political and religious leaders beforehand. It was not just to situate St. John the Baptist as a person in history but also to begin to introduce the true humble nature of the coming Messiah, Jesus Christ, the King of kings and the Lord of lords by presenting His precursor, St. John the Baptist, as a humble and obedient servant who was faithful to his mission.


St. Luke wanted to show that the people who were ready to recognize and accept the Messiah in His humble state were people who themselves are humble and poor, relying only on the mercy and providence of God. And since St. John the Baptist lived humbly, penitently, and obediently to God's will, he became the effective voice of God, the *"voice of one who cries out in the wilderness of people's hearts"* calling them to conversion, to return to God and turn away from their sins. His lifestyle and his preaching gave credibility to His message and thus converted people who came forward to him and asked him to give them the baptism of repentance.

St. John the Baptist is still that voice of God during this Advent season calling us to embrace the true spirit of Advent – inviting us with the same message, *"prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths,"* to continue our Advent journey of repentance and conversion as we await Christ's Second Coming. Conversion calls us to a change of heart, of mind, and of soul. It calls us to die to self, turning away from our self-centered will every day.

This radical change that we voluntarily embrace demands from us a disciplined and responsible life, where our heart strives to love more, our mind longs for greater knowledge of, and intimacy with God, and our soul seeks holiness every day by accepting and submitting ourselves with trust to God's will and reign. It involves being faithful in putting God first in life and asking Him in prayer how we can best serve Him and do His will each day.

Daily prayer, receiving the sacraments of the Eucharist and Penance, good works, acts of penance, and renunciation of our constant pursuit of comfort and pleasure, power, and money while uniting our difficulties, suffering, and pain to the salvific Passion of Christ are the ways we respond to God's call to conversion and holiness. Let us make this Advent better than the ones before. **-Fr. Robert**

All parishioners are invited to a special mass to celebrate the Mother of the Americas.



Celebrating Family

With Thanksgiving just behind us, and as we await the "coming" of our Lord this Advent season, it's an opportune time to reflect on the role of marriage and family in the Catholic Church. The family is often called the "small church" or domestic church. "The well-being of the individual person and of both human and Christian society is closely bound up with the healthy state of the community of marriage and the family." (Gaudium et Speces-The Church in the Modern World)

Pope Francis talked about the role of family as a "small church" in one of his many speeches on this topic. "It is the place where one learns to love, it is the natural centre of human life. It is made up of faces, of people who love, dialogue, make self-sacrifices for one another and defend life, especially of the most vulnerable and the weakest. One could say, without exaggeration, that the family is the driving force of the world and of history.

Our personality develops in the family, by growing up with our mom and dad, our brothers and sisters, by breathing in the warmth of the home. The family is the place where we receive our name, it is the place of affection, the space of intimacy, where one acquires the art of dialogue and interpersonal communication. In the family, the person becomes aware of his or her own dignity and, especially if their upbringing is Christian, each one recognizes the dignity of every single person, in a particular way the sick, the weak and the marginalized."



GOD'S RECONSTRUCTION PLAN

We heard Baruch, in the first reading, picturing our broken world reborn: the dispersed being carried home, tears wiped away, righteousness and justice, peace and worship. How we wish it could all be true!

It will be true, Paul declares, optimistic that God, who has already begun such good work in us, will continue to complete it for the day of Christ's glorious return, increasing our love and sharpening our discernment of the values that endure.

So we should begin this second week of Advent reinvigorated with hope in God's plan for the world's salvation.

But John the Baptist reminds us that God's "reconstruction plan" for the world's transformation begins much closer to home: what twists and turns of my own life must be untangled, what lofty mountains of my own pride and self-centeredness brought low, which gorge-deep valleys of my

own indifference and neglect filled in? Come, Lord Jesus, and make the whole creation new—but start right here, right now, with me!

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Almost nine hundred years ago, Saint Bernard of Clairvaux suggested in one of his Advent homilies that we should think of three Advents of Christ: the First, when Christ came in humility as Mary's Child, clothed in our human nature; the Second, when Christ will come in glory as Judge and Redeemer of the world.

Then Saint Bernard speaks of a Middle Coming, an "in the meantime" Advent, when Christ comes to us in his Word, in the Eucharist, and in those who need our love and care, family and friends, neighbors and strangers.

That's this year's Advent, the one we're celebrating now; and this Advent's question is: how attentive am I to Christ's coming into my life-story, right here, right now? © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

Pay attention to TikTok


Keeping tabs on how our children are using social media can seem quite daunting, even for parents who know their way around social media.
