

COVID-19 PHASED REOPENING UPDATES

- In-person Masses to resume (in the church):

Weekday Masses: 9:00 am Daily Mass beginning Monday, Feb. 1.

Sunday Masses: 8:30 am and 10:30 am Mass beginning Sunday, Feb. 7.

- Sunday Virtual Mass will continue to be available online.

‘Drive-thru’ Communion Reception Line

A “drive thru” communion line is offered each Sunday from 10:00-10:45 am. Please line up going south on Cloverly Avenue by car and turn into the church parking lot. PLEASE DO NOT PARK. We will stand and distribute communion to people in the car in the hand. Please wear a mask as we approach your car. Drive off safely through exit on Broadway.

NOTE: Communion Reception Line will move to Noon-1:00 pm beginning on Sunday, Feb. 7.

‘Drive-thru’ Confessions

‘Drive-thru’ Confessions are offered at 1:00 pm on Saturdays. Please wear a mask and drive through the church parking lot where you will be directed through the back alley to approach one of the priests who will hear your brief confession from outside the passenger side of the car.

If there are multiple people in the car, the passenger/s may exit and stand at a safe distance and we will come to them after hearing the driver’s confession. This is not a prolonged counseling moment: we want anybody who wants a brief confession following these months of lockdown to have the opportunity, so please be prepared and expedient. Drive out safely the rear gate onto Live Oak Avenue.

Pastoral Office Hours

The Pastoral Office is currently closed to the public until further notice; however, the office will continue to be staffed to receive phone calls, e-mails, and conduct parish business Monday-Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.

- Items can left in office mailbox; it’s checked regularly.
- Please be reminded that the Chapel is still closed and no parish-related meetings, events or activities are being conducted on or off property at this time (Room reservations for activities are not being accepted at this time as well.).
- Parish buildings and grounds are closed to the public (staff and vendors excluded).
- There are no other sacraments that are being scheduled or performed at this time.
- Eucharistic Ministers should not visit the sick.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

We realize that many of you are still reluctant to come together for an in-person Mass experience and prefer to continue to view online from home. We respect that decision and support it as the Archbishop has indefinitely extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

We continue to be amid the highest point of the pandemic this month; however, we feel that we need to move ahead cautiously, with common sense and with respect for those who are frightened. We have felt through the hot summer months, the incessant fire/smoke seasons, and then the bitter cold that it would not be right to ask you to sit outdoors.

Considering recent Supreme Court decisions regarding indoor religious celebrations, we are beginning once again with indoor Masses with the 9:00 am Daily Mass on Monday, Feb. 1, and an 8:30 am and 10:30 am Mass beginning Sunday, Feb. 7.

Reservations will not be required to attend these Masses. Please know that every participant MUST still wear a face covering over nose/mouth, physically distance, and sanitize their hands upon entering and exiting.

We encourage only families or persons living under the same roof to sit in proximity to one another and respectfully ask that all parishioners exercise caution, common sense, and spiritual care for those who are more susceptible to becoming ill, including our priests.

We hope and pray that while we are reopening for limited services, that those who are sick, feeling sick, have weakened immune systems, etc. would continue to celebrate with us from home.

We will continue to offer a Virtual Sunday Mass and a Drive-thru Communion Reception Line. Updated Time: The Drive-thru Communion Reception Line will move to Noon-1:00 pm beginning on Sunday, Feb. 7.

Confessions, weather permitting, will remain as a drive-thru option only at 1:00 pm on Saturdays. We will not hear confessions indoors under any circumstance until it is safer to do so.


While we are opening the church for limited services, we are NOT opening the parish grounds for any group to hold meetings. This will not occur until the vaccine has been available widespread and herd immunity has occurred. We project this will not be until early Fall.

Finally, any aspect of this reopening can change at any time in accordance with ADLA guidelines and the orders of the health officials. If we were to have three cases of people testing positive for COVID-19, we would be shut down once again for quarantine. We have had a few cases already, so let's continue to proceed, supporting our community efforts rather than any negative options.


Thank you for your understanding, your prayerful support, and your patience as we have all dealt with this very difficult year behind us and the next year ahead of us.



Sunday Readings

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



Reading I

1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep.

Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me."

Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening."

When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

I have waited, waited for the LORD, and he stooped toward me and heard my cry. And he put a new song into my mouth, a hymn to our God.

Sacrifice or offering you wished not, but ears open to obedience you gave me. Holocausts or sin-offerings you sought not; then said I, "Behold I come."

Reading II

1 Cor 6:13c-15a, 17-20

Brothers and sisters: The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power.

Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality.

Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body.

Gospel

Jn 1:35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God."

The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?"

They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day.

It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus.

He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —.

Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

Response: *Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.*


Father Mark's Corner

I rarely watch local news (unless there is a disaster or police chase) because it is mostly filled with sappy news of Hollywood relationships, the rich and famous, politicians not doing their job and ordinary people in their moments of suffering. For me, that is all "fake news." The broadcast news and television shows like it never challenge me to be different or to move into a new direction. Rather, it is just depressing. So, I choose NOT to view it daily.

On the other hand, our call to faithful discipleship demands that we put effort, persistence and an acquiescence to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. In fact, to be a disciple of Christ means growth and mobility. It requires moving from our zone of comfort and an ability to "not stand still" but to follow wherever He may go or call us to be. We are called to growth. Is this a deal breaker?

Many people do not like change or anything that makes them feel uncomfortable. Yet, the Gospel should make everyone squirm because it calls us to be different and to grow. Are you willing to hear His voice calling you into a new reality and relationship? Then, come...and see!



New Virtual Bereavement Sessions Beginning

St. Luke Church will be offering a virtual eight-week Bereavement Support Program for those who have lost someone dear. The program is open to all faiths, non-threatening, caring and very loving toward those who have suffered a loss.

Sessions will be held virtually at 7:00 pm on Zoom **Thursday, Feb. 4, through March 25**. The only cost involved is \$12.00 for the workbook. Please call the Pastoral Office at (626) 291-5900 to register. Please provide your e-mail address and phone number. **Reservations are required.**

St. Luke Conference Society of St. Vincent de Paul Report

St. Luke Conference Society of St. Vincent de Paul completed nine years of service at the end of September 2020. It presently has 15 Active members and 9 Associate members. Active members attend meetings twice a month, which are currently conducted by phone. Associate members help with the packaging and distribution of food which was discontinued during the imposition of the lock down.

Our Service during our fiscal year from October to September 2020 accounted for:

- (1) Rental assistance and motel stays to 16 families (41 individuals).
- (2) Assistance for utilities, vehicle repairs, and apartment applications to 5 families.
- (3) From food drives by schools and other community organizations and donations from parishioners, we collected approximately \$17,000 worth of non-perishable food goods. Supplemented by donated funds and assistance from the L.A. Regional Food Bank, between October 2019 and February 2020, we distributed food valued at \$33,000 to over 75 family units each month. Due to the lock down, service has been temporarily discontinued.
- (4) We distributed grocery gift cards to close to 60 families each month from May to September.
- (5) Our members made 30 home visits, 2 hospital visits, 7 eldercare visits and made 62 assistance visits to members of the local homeless community.



In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus' first spoken words in the Gospel of John: "What are you looking for?" This penetrating question reverberates throughout John's Gospel. The disciples who form Jesus' first community, and many others who meet Jesus during his life, are drawn to him, seeking something they can't quite name. As Jesus called and formed his community of disciples, he probed their hearts and allowed them to probe his heart. They shared their deepest needs, hopes, and commitments.

Jesus' words might be directed to us, here and now. Sometimes we struggle to name what we really want. In our faith journey, in prayer and in lived experience, we learn to share our dreams and also to open our hearts to know God's dreams. In time, with lots of practice, with many successes and failures, we learn to trust God to shape and to fulfill our deepest desires.

YOUR SERVANT IS LISTENING

We hear of young Samuel today, dedicated to a life of service to God, under the guidance of Eli, a Temple priest. Twice,

Samuel hears the call of God and says "Here I am" to Eli. At last Eli recognizes that it is God who is calling Samuel. When Samuel hears God a third time, Samuel does not say "Here I am," but "Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." We can see a subtle shift as Samuel moves away from announcing his intention to serve and more clearly opens himself to God's voice. Samuel allows God to take the initiative, and attends first to God's intentions rather than his own.

Samuel's story helps us to remember that accepting God's call is not only about a new chapter in our personal story. Our acceptance is, more profoundly, a new moment in God's story. Even in our smallest "yes," God celebrates our partnership in God's great work. Through our openness and acceptance, God has new opportunities to bring all of us into loving unity with God.


