

Scripture Reflection



Let Us Pray for a Deeper *Faith & Love* for Jesus in the *Holy Eucharist*

Many disciples of Jesus left Him, returned to their former way of life, and no longer followed Him because they could not accept His teachings when He said that He would give them His Body and Blood as Spiritual Food and Drink. They were scandalized at the fact that Jesus made such a radical claim that unless they eat His flesh and drink His blood, they would not have life in them.

They thought that Jesus was promoting cannibalism, which was against their religion. But Peter and the other Apostles believed in the words of Jesus even though they did not understand completely what He was saying.

They placed all their faith and trust in Him as the Messiah, as their Savior and Lord when Peter said: *"Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that You are the Holy One of God."*

This is the kind of humble and trusting faith that we need if we are to recognize the supreme importance of Holy Communion to all of us.

Sadly, many Catholics, especially after the lockdown, have stayed away from the Eucharist. But even before the Pandemic many didn't think it is necessary for them to receive Jesus in Holy Communion regularly. Recent survey shows that only 25% of Americans who call themselves Catholic attend Mass regularly.

Worse, close to two-thirds of American Catholics say they don't believe in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist—and many of those are among the 25% who still attend Mass out of habit or because they still believe it is an obligation. They have lost faith

in eternal life. And they have lost faith in God. Because of that, they do not find hope, peace, and meaning in life.

Perhaps if we take Jesus' words and trust Him more like the Apostles, we will experience the manifold blessings that He gives us in Holy Communion. Then we will appreciate more the great privilege, honor, and blessing of receiving the Lord. The saints teach us how to approach Jesus in the Eucharist and in Holy Communion.

Saint Thomas Aquinas taught us that with the Holy Eucharist, all our five senses fail. Only faith can lift the veil and perceive the reality of Christ's real presence and His sacrifice. St. John Vianney, the patron saint of parish priests, with tears on his eyes would point to the Tabernacle during his many sermons and say to his congregation, "God is there. Jesus is there."

When Padre Pio was asked how many blessings we receive when we go to Mass and Holy Communion, he responded by saying that we won't know until we die. Then we will see the superabundant blessings that we have missed because of our lack of proper disposition, respect, and reverence toward the Lord.

We would regret it for all eternity because we took many Masses for granted. That is why Padre Pio also said, "It would be easier for the world to survive without the sun than to do without Holy Mass."

Let us pray for a deeper faith and love for Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. And just like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, may He make our hearts burn within us with deeper fervor and love for Him as we receive Him in Holy Communion.






RCIA Classes to Begin in September

LIFE, JUSTICE AND PEACE SPOTLIGHT

The Cross of Infertility

Lauren Allen and her husband had been married for a year and they struggled with infertility. Lauren's prayer to God was always to get pregnant and have a baby. However, God had something else in mind. "I was driving down the back roads, like I do sometimes when I'm upset or to think or pray. And I just heard God say to me, 'you're called to carry your cross, not pray that it goes away from you'. He was asking for me to create a resource that would put out valid Church teachings on different parts of infertility, and lead people towards holiness, and not towards anger."

As a result, in January 2021, Lauren Allen, a Catholic from Texas, launched The Fruitful Hollow, <https://www.thefruitfulhollow.com/>, an online ministry for women with infertility.

The Fruitful Hollow is a place where women can connect, share their struggles and find comfort. The ministry runs a weekly blog post or an article on its website about topics related to infertility and spirituality, from a Catholic perspective, to help women on their journey. The Fruitful Hollow team has a particular devotion to St. Gianna Beretta Molla, the patron saint of infertility, and they look to scripture for stories of infertility. The website offers resources, including guides for journaling and information about patron saints of infertility. Another feature of the website is the Sisters of Hannah Ministry. The Sisters of Hannah are women who mentor other women with infertility. They are a listening ear, and they emotionally support and pray for women on their journey.

The website provides information about Church teaching on modern medical responses to infertility, such as in vitro fertilization. The site includes information about Creighton Model System (a particular method of Natural Family Planning) that can be used in conjunction with NaProTechnology (restorative reproductive healthcare) to treat fertility problems in a way that is completely natural and pro-life. "When you start to realize that you have a problem getting pregnant...a lot of the mainstream OB-GYNs, that's what they know, so it's unfortunately what they push," Lauren Allen said. "You have to really be educated in your Church teachings to know what's okay to do, and what's not. There's not a lot of education in the Catholic Church. Where would you find that unless you were searching for it? I don't think it's a well-known teaching."

Katie is editor of the Fruitful Hollow. She and her husband have been married for five years, and they have not been able to conceive. Katie said, "I think on such an isolating journey, community is key. I think that's one of the best things to have come out of The Fruitful Hollow, is just finding such a community of like-minded Catholic women and men who are struggling with the same questions, and this rollercoaster of an infertility journey, and how different it can look."

Lauren Allen said, "I want people to know...that the plan that we have for our lives is never the plan that God has. You are still called to be fruitful, even if it's not in the way that we think of when we often think of fruitfulness. We're called to be open to life, but even if you...never conceive, there's still a call to be fruitful and work towards holiness."

WHOM SHOULD WE FOLLOW?

Today's Gospel is the conclusion of the Bread of Life discourse in John. After Jesus' continued insistence that he is the Bread of Life come down from heaven, and that his words are "Spirit and life," most of his disciples drift away. The Twelve, however, affirm their faith in Jesus, whom Simon Peter professes to "have the words of eternal life." In the first reading, Joshua and the Israelites are preparing to enter the Promised Land, and Joshua asks the people to decide which god they will follow, the Lord their God, or the gods of neighboring peoples. The Responsorial Psalm features Psalm 34, the "taste and see" psalm, that reflects the kinds of struggles the Israelites faced during their sojourn in the wilderness. In the second reading, Paul gives counsel for maintaining domestic peace and happiness.

CROSSROADS IN LIFE, THEN AND NOW

Sometimes in life we find ourselves at a crossroads, faced with an existential choice that will alter the course of our life. We are aware, at these moments, just how significant our choice will be and that there will be no going back.

In both the first reading and the Gospel we see such moments calling people to make such choices. Which god will the Israelites follow? Joshua, their leader after Moses, knows that the area around the Promised Land is occupied by other peoples, with other gods. Perhaps remembering how, after Moses had gone up Mount Sinai, the Israelites set up a golden calf to worship, Joshua worries that they may again be susceptible to such attractions. He is asking them for a commitment, and proclaims, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

CAN WE STAY WITH JESUS?

The people who were frenetically following Jesus, crossing the lake twice to pursue him, eating the bread he miraculously provided, are now puzzled by Jesus proclaiming himself as "the bread of life," and they are incredulous. They can go with him no farther, so they gradually drift away. The Twelve, however, stay with Jesus. What else could they do? Who else offers such a profound vision of human life? Peter expresses it well: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

Not all of our life's crossroads involve our faith, but some do. Perhaps there is someone in your parish who chose to become Catholic and is now alienated from their family; someone who is unhappy with a new pastor and wondering about looking for a different parish; someone who was especially distressed by the clergy sex abuse and prayed long and hard before deciding that she needed her parish to get through it. There may be many in your parish facing such choices, and they need our support and our prayers. In the meantime, we can hope that someday they will again experience Jesus as the Holy One of God, offering them words of eternal life.




