Immunization Requirements for Grade 12 Students 2018-2019

In accordance with the State of Ohio Immunization Requirements for school attendance, two (2) doses of the **MCV4** (Meningococcal) vaccine are required **prior** to entry into twelfth (12th) grade.

****NOTE:** If your child had their 1st dose of MCV4 at 16 years of age or older, a 2nd dose is not required**

If your child is in need of these vaccines, please make an appointment soon with either:

- Your family physician or health care provider
- Visit any Minute Clinic (CVS, Rite-Aid, Walgreens) – no appointment needed
- Cuyahoga County Department of Health (call 216-201-2041 to make an appointment).

Don't delay in making an appointment! Summer and the week before school starts is very busy at most physician offices and you may find it difficult to get an appointment in a timely manner.

Please submit an updated copy of immunizations to the School Nurse
to verify immunizations BEFORE the senior year begins.
Documentation must be received by August 10, 2018.

*****According to Section 3701.13, on the 15th day after school entrance, it will be necessary to exclude from school all students who do not meet the above requirements. *****

**** PLEASE** make sure any immunization information is directed to the **school nurse** and **not athletics**. (Sport physical records are kept in the athletic dept. and not routinely reviewed by the school nurse)
