
Chief Judge Order No. 60

All jury trials in criminal and civil cases in the Southern District of California in which a trial date was previously set are continued until March 8, 2021. New trial or status dates will be set in individual cases on or after March 8, 2021, unless this Order is extended. However, all previously set trial-specific deadlines relating to pending criminal cases, including those for filing motions *in limine* and jury instructions, exchanging exhibits, and providing notice of expert witnesses remain in effect. Individual district judges may continue trial-specific deadlines in civil cases at their discretion. New dates will be set in individual civil cases on or before March 8, 2021, unless this Order is extended.

On its own motion, the Court finds that the period of suspension of criminal trials and other criminal proceedings implemented by this Order is excluded under the Speedy Trial Act. Under 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(A), the Court finds that this temporary suspension of in-person proceedings serves the ends of justice and outweighs the interests of the public, of the government, and of criminal defendants in a speedy trial. The Court also relies on the previously issued Judicial Emergency Declaration under 18 U.S.C. § 3174. The period of exclusion will be in effect from the date of this Order until March 8, 2021, absent further order of the Court or that of any individual district judge. The Court may extend the period of exclusion as circumstances warrant. However, this Order does not toll any statutes of limitations or any statutory deadline for the filing of an appeal.
