Now, at the age of 21, she easily delivered Xander with the grace and style with which she does everything else.

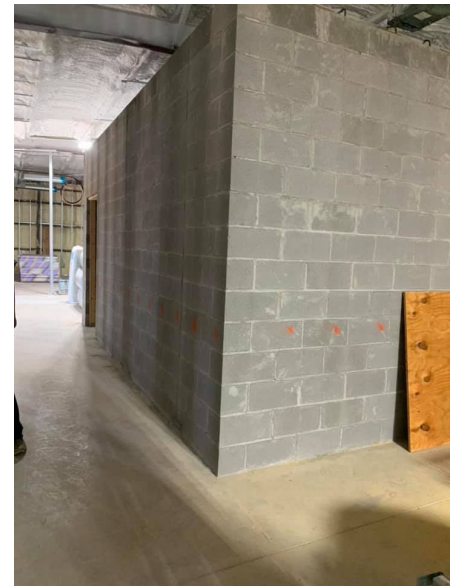
Mom and colt are doing well, and Goldie will return to work this fall after weaning Xander.
