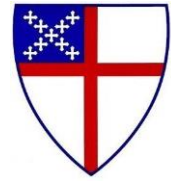

Reflection from Deacon Pam

Dear St. Paul's Family,

It has been a wonderful ten months serving as your Interim Deacon-in-Charge. Deacons are not often given this opportunity and I am grateful to our Lord, our Bishop, our wardens and vestry, and to all of you for allowing me to serve you in this capacity. You have been supportive and encouraging in every way. I was always told when you take on something new, to leave it better than you found it. I believe that to be true in this case. Our attendance has increased, our financial status is favorable, and we have continued with our basic programming and even added several new opportunities for education, fellowship, and additional worship. I owe these marvelous improvements to you for sticking with me and with our church these last many months.

The joyous news that we have a new rector echoes in our hallways as the anticipation of his arrival builds along with our curiosities of what might change and what will stay the same under new leadership. Our wait is short and soon we will be ready to follow him as he begins his ministry here at St. Paul's. I would like to offer a few recommendations in order to make this new beginning a wonderful time for everyone.

1. Speaking from experience: Please refrain from texting or calling him before 7:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. unless it is something he needs to know immediately. Questions like 'Are there any cans of green beans in the food pantry?' or 'What time is the service next Wednesday?' can wait until working hours.
2. Give him time to get to know everyone. It is hard coming into a new parish and learning names, connections, and history of the parishioners. He'll get it all eventually. There's no rush.
3. Don't expect him to be perfect. Clergy are people. They're not Jesus. No one is the best at everything. Preaching, teaching, pastoral care, and administration are all part of the job, and each person has their unique approach to all of it.
4. Don't expect him to be in the office ALL the time. He will also be making pastoral visits, participating in outreach and community efforts, and connecting with other clergy and organizations he needs to in order to expand St. Paul's presence in Columbus. Making an appointment always assures he will be available for you. That's not to say you shouldn't drop by because I'm sure he will enjoy seeing you during the week, when he is available.
5. Please remember to notify the office when you or someone in your family wants a pastoral visit. We do not always hear about it through the grapevine. Your rector will want to speak with you and pray with you but needs to be notified.
6. Pray for him every single day. Pray that he will take some time for himself and his family when he needs it. Pray that his ministry here will be something he looks forward to every morning when he wakes up, and thankful for each evening before he sleeps. Pray for our parish as well. Pray that we will continue to grow and love one another through everything we do.

I did not speak with Father Andrew before writing this. I am just conveying my thoughts in hopes and prayers that these recommendations will make our new beginning together exciting and delightful.

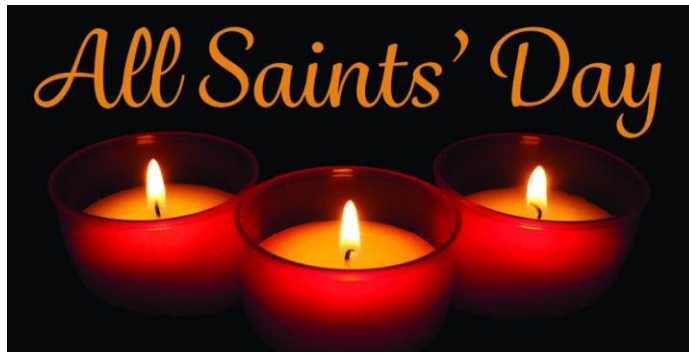

In the New Testament, the word “saints” is used to describe the entire membership of the Christian community, and in the Collect for All Saints’ Day the word “elect” is used in a similar sense. From very early times, however, the word “saint” came to be applied primarily to persons of heroic sanctity, whose deeds were recalled with gratitude by later generations.

Beginning in the tenth century, it became customary to set aside another day on which the church remembered that vast body of the faithful who, though no less members of the company of the redeemed, are unknown in the wider fellowship of the church. It was also a day for particular remembrance of family members and friends.

Though the observance of the day was abolished at the Reformation because of abuses connected with masses for the dead, a renewed understanding of its meaning has led to a widespread acceptance of this commemoration among Anglicans, and to its inclusion as an optional observance in the calendar of the Episcopal Church.

The Collect for All Souls Day

O God, the Maker and Redeemer of all believers: Grant to the faithful departed the unsearchable benefits of the passion of your Son; that on the day of his appearing they may be manifested as your children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.
