



I write to thank you all for your trust in putting me in a position of guidance and protection for our church. It was a journey of challenges, of creating, of disappointment, of amazing support, new energy and Thanksgiving for our Deacon-in-charge, Pam Rhea. My thanks and appreciation for Ronnie, Lori, Ellen, our choir, and outreach committees, our SPES Director, school teachers, and school board.

My son had a terrible accident in early September, clearing land of dead trees on his family's property; he was propelled 15' in the air landing on his left foot, splitting tibia and destroying his ankle. (He is fine and has made an amazing recovery, still ongoing). His sons, ages 8 and 5 with him, kept asking, "Are you dead yet?" He, thankfully, is recovering. I, no longer your Sr. Warden, submit this last post though and am happy to be "not dead yet".

George and Emily then moved to Argentina, where they served as missionaries for four years. After returning to the United States, they moved to Princeton, NJ, where George earned both his MDiv and his PhD (in the history of Christianity) at Princeton Theological Seminary. Before moving to Starkville, George worked as a research specialist at Princeton University and held teaching assistantships at both Princeton Seminary and Princeton University. In addition, after his ordination to the priesthood, he served for several months as Assistant Priest at All Saints' Episcopal Church in Princeton. He loves both the Church and the academy and delights not only in serving in both spheres, but also in building bridges between the two. George and Emily have two daughters.


