Update on the mask project:

We handed out kits and collected masks through July 31st, and left a basket of kits and a tub for completed sets on the windowsill by the back door of the parish hall. We delivered 1170 masks the Columbus Municipal School District on Monday morning, and the students went back to school the following Tuesday. We've already gone over 1200, due to masks being completed after the initial delivery. We'll be finishing up, using the rest of the donated materials, and plan to purchase masks with the remainder of monetary donations. Trent Kelly's office contacted the church about the masks, and got information to be included in his newsletter. If you receive it, be looking out for St. Paul's news!
