

Sunday Offerings



Our Lenten studies this year will include six classes on a 1962 choral masterpiece, the War Requiem of Benjamin Britten. Britten (1913-1976) composed this orchestral work for chorus, boys choir, and soloists for the consecration of Coventry Cathedral, rebuilt after being bombed in 1940.

War Requiem combines the very old setting of the Roman Catholic Mass with nine poems by Wilfred Owen, who was killed leading British forces on November 4, 1918. **Armistice came one week later, and Owens' family was hearing the Armistice bells when they learned their son and brother was dead.**

For our class, George Hazard will discuss the war and Owens' career and poetry. Dawn Barham will comment on various aspects of the musical score. In each class, we will be listening to the 1963 recording of War Requiem, with Britten himself conducting.

The class meets in the chapel at 9:15 on Sunday mornings.




