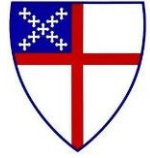


## May Outreach
