Bishop Chatard Junior Edreece Redmond II is one of the 18 students in Indiana selected to serve on the IHSAA Student Advisory Committee. One of his goals is to raise awareness of special needs athletes and bring the special 50th Anniversary Commemorative “Champions Together” Banner to Chatard.



Champions Together is the collaboration between the IHSAA and Special Olympics Indiana. In order to obtain the Special 50th Anniversary Commemorative banner, there are two main objectives BCHS must meet.

- 1) Participate in a unified event as a school, (which is a sporting event that involves children that have intellectual disabilities, teaming up with students from Chatard).
- 2) Raise a minimum of \$3,000 for Special Olympics Indiana*

So far in the planning committee's efforts to achieve the Banner, they've raised \$1,400 via fundraising and individual donations! They also participated in and placed 2nd in the Unified Bowling State Championship on March 16th!
