

Welcome to Visitors and Guests

We are delighted to have you with us today. The ushers will be glad to assist in any way they can to make your visit more comfortable. Please do take a moment to introduce yourself to the clergy at the door following the service and sign the guest book in the church porch / vestibule.

Child care is available during the 10am service for infants to age 4. Parents are given pagers. An usher will be happy to escort you there. **The nursery is open.**

Sunday School (from age 3 through grade 12) begins after children and young people receive Holy Communion or a Blessing at the Altar Rail during the 10am service, then proceed to their classrooms. We are excited to have everyone back!

The Rite of Holy Baptism

The Presentation and Examination of the Candidate:.....BCP 301

Celebrant: The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Then the celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.

The candidate who is unable to answer for themselves is presented individually by their Sponsors as follows:

I present Harrison Moore to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

I present Hadley Moore to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

When all have been presented the Celebrant asks the parents and godparents:

Will you be responsible for seeing that they are brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God’s help.

Will you by your prayers and witness help them to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God’s help.

Question: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love.

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

The Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these individuals in their life in Christ?

*People: **We will.***

The Celebrant then calls the congregation to stand and join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew the solemn vows of Holy Baptism.

Let us join with these individuals who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Prayers for the Candidates.....BCP 305

The Celebrant then says to the congregation

Let us now pray for Harrison & Hadley who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

A person appointed leads the following petitions

Celebrant: Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Open their heart to thy grace and truth.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Fill them with thy holy and life-giving Spirit.

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for the gift of water, over which thy Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation; through which thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise; in which thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, being manifested thereby as the Messiah, the Christ, who leadeth us, through his precious death and mighty resurrection, from the bondage of sin unto life everlasting.

We give thee thanks, O Father, for the water of Baptism, in which we are buried with Christ in his death; by which we partake of his resurrection; through which we are made regenerate of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship them that come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we beseech thee, by thy Holy Spirit.

That those who here are cleansed from sin and made regenerate may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior, to whom, with thee, and the same Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Baptism BCP 307

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon the candidate saying

Harrison, I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, And of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Hadley, I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, And of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using Chrism and saying

Harrison, thou art sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen**

Hadley, thou art sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen**

When this action has been completed The Priest at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them, saying

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank thee that by the water and the Holy Spirit thou hast bestowed upon them thy servant the forgiveness of sin and hast raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and persevere, a spirit to know and to love thee, and the gift of joy and wonder in all thy works. **Amen.**

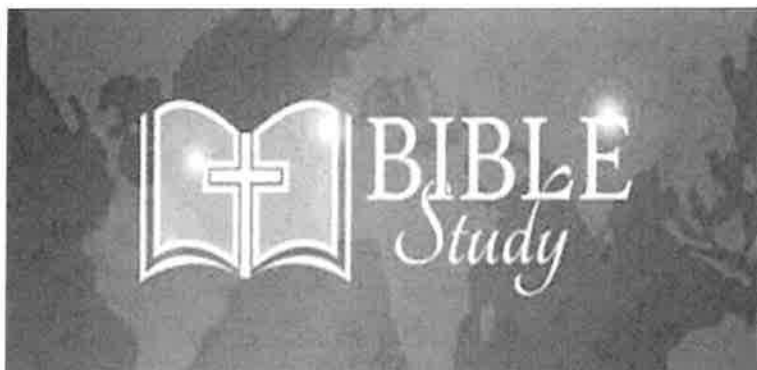


Bible Study Now in Session

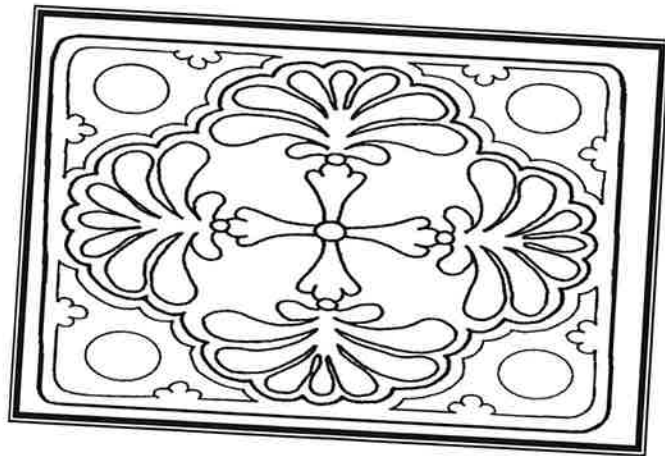
