



Lector The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Jesus came to his own country; and his disciples followed him. And on the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue; and many who heard him were astonished, saying, “Where did this man get all this? What is the wisdom given to him? What mighty works are wrought by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?” And they took offense at him. And Jesus said to them, “A prophet is not without honor, except in his own country, and among his own kin, and in his own house.” And he could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands upon a few sick people and healed them. And he marveled because of their unbelief. ” And he went about among the villages teaching. And he called to him the twelve, and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He charged them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not put on two tunics. And he said to them, “Where you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. And if any place will not receive you and they refuse to hear you, when you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet for a testimony against them.” So they went out and preached that men should repent. The Rite of Holy Baptism

The Presentation and Examination of the Candidate: BCP 301

Celebrant: The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The candidates who are able to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Sponsors as follows:

I present Théoden William Carr to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

When all have been presented the Celebrant asks the parents and godparents:

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.

Then the celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.

Question: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love.

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

The Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ?

People: ***We will.***

The Celebrant then calls the congregation to stand and join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew the solemn vows of Holy Baptism.

Let us join with this person who is committing himself to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant BCP 305

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: ***I believe in God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth;***

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Son?

People: ***I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord;
who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, dead, and buried.
He descended into hell.
The third day he rose again from the dead.
He ascended into heaven,
and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty.
From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.***

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Holy Ghost?

People: ***I believe in the Holy Ghost,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.***

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers ?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: ***I will, with God's help.***

Prayers for the CandidatesBCP 305

The Celebrant then says to the congregation

Let us now pray for Théoden William who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

A person appointed leads the following petitions

Celebrant: Deliver him, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Open his heart to thy grace and truth.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Fill him with thy holy and life-giving Spirit.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Keep him in the faith and communion of thy holy Church.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Send him into the world in witness to thy love.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

Celebrant: Bring him to the fullness of thy peace and glory.

People: ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

The Celebrant says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ thy Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who liveth and reigneth now and for ever. **Amen**

Thanksgiving Over the WaterBCP 306

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

The Lord be with you.

People: **And with thy Spirit**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: **It is meet and right so to do.**

We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for the gift of water, over which thy Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation; through which thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise; in which thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, being manifested thereby as the Messiah, the Christ, who leadeth us, through his precious death and mighty resurrection, from the bondage of sin unto life everlasting.

We give thee thanks, O Father, for the water of Baptism, in which we are buried with Christ in his death; by which we partake of his resurrection; through which we are made regenerate of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship them that come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Celebrant dips the Paschal Candle into the water.

Now sanctify this water, we beseech thee, by thy Holy Spirit.

That those who here are cleansed from sin and made regenerate may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior, to whom, with to thee, and the same Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

The Baptism.....BCP 307

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon the candidate saying

Théoden William, I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, And of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using Chrism and saying

Théoden William, thou art sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen**

When this action has been completed The Priest at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them, saying

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank thee that by the water and the Holy Spirit thou hast bestowed upon him thy servant the forgiveness of sin and hast raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and persevere, a spirit to know and to love thee, and the gift of joy and wonder in all thy works. **Amen.**

Procession from the Font

All are sprinkled with baptismal water as a reminder of their baptism.

Then the newly baptized are welcomed.

Celebrant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People: ***We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in her eternal priesthood.***



Burial Announcement: Canon William V. Rauscher

October 17, 1932 – July 3, 2024

Born in Long Branch, NJ, raised in Highlands, he was the son of the late William V., Sr. and Marie E. (Gautschy). He was a 1954 graduate of Glassboro State Teachers College and the Philadelphia Divinity School in 1957. He was ordained to the Diaconate in 1957 and the Priesthood in 1957 by The Right Reverend Alfred L. Banyard. He served as rector of St. Stephens', Florence, NJ from 1957 to 1960, and then as rector of Christ Church, Woodbury, NJ from 1960 to 1996. In 1971 he was made an Honorary Canon of Trinity Cathedral, Trenton, NJ.

During his years as rector of Christ Church, Woodbury he sponsored numerous speakers, hosted a local school of religion, and brought to Woodbury prominent personalities, including Astronaut Edgar D. Mitchell. Locally in 1966 Rauscher was the

Convener of the first Woodbury Ecumenical Panel Discussions on approaches to Holy Communion held at Saint Patrick's Roman Catholic Church. During the Civil Rights movement he was one of the few clergy, along with his curate The Rev. John E. Bird and the Christ Church congregation, who appeared on the Court House steps to promote racial equality.




