<u>Sunday School</u> (from age 3 through grade 12) begins after children and young people receive Holy Communion or a Blessing at the Altar Rail during the 10AM service and then proceed to their classrooms. (Most Sundays September through May). There is Sunday School today.

<u>Adult Forum</u> is held in the Upper Assembly Room following the 10AM service when Sunday School is in session, and ends at 12 NOON when the children are dismissed from their classes. All are welcome!

<u>A Lift</u> is available for those who require assistance in reaching the Upper and Lower Assembly Rooms. The ushers will be glad to help with its operation.

<u>Safety Precaution</u>: Because there is no adult supervision in the parish house, children under the age of 13 leaving the service for any reason need to be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

<u>Exiting and Entering</u>—To avoid unnecessary distractions during the service, please try to exit and enter during a hymn if possible. (But we do understand that when urgent needs arise it may not be possible!)



Lector A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

ehold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon him, he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not fail or be discouraged till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law. 




