What to Say...

Anne Lamott once said, *"My mind is like a bad neighborhood. You never want to go there alone."* The truth is, we are alone with our thoughts all of the time. Charles Fernyhough, professor at Durham University in the U.K., offers a historical overview of "inner speech" in his book, *The Voices Within*. "Inner Speech" is the more scientific term for *"talking to yourself in your head."* Because we don't have to use our tongues and lips and voice boxes to produce inner dialogue, we can produce speech much faster when talking to ourselves. One researcher cited in Fernyhough's work clocks inner speech at an average pace of 4,000 words per minute which is ten times faster than verbal speech. *And* it's more condensed as we don't have to use full sentences to talk to ourselves because we know what we mean.



As I sat down to write this first article as one of your pastors at Broadway, my inner speech was maxing out at incredible rates. *"This is really happening,"* I thought to myself. *"All these years of soul-walking with this church and here I am, writing to them as pastor. What do I say?"* *"I could say this... I could say that... should there be one of those clever column names like 'Mark's Musings' or something?"* ... The funny thing is that your inner speech is cranking up right now too. *"What is he going to say?"* you're wondering. *"And why doesn't he just say it already!"* *"And please don't call the column, 'Mark's Musings'... seriously."*

My mind raced. I thought about the way in which we've come together at this point in Broadway's history. I thought of so many of you I've met already who have been so gracious to my family. *"What can we do to help?"* you've asked. Asking alone has been more help than you could possibly know. My inner

speech jumped to Terry and Nick and the staff team who have carried so much this year and yet have invited me in as an insider, not a stranger left to onboard without a map of any kind. They have epitomized grace and you know this about them already. *"Grace. Grace. Grace,"* my mind raced. *"We're all going to need it,"* I thought, knowing that connecting names and personalities and community cultures and communal taboos all take time to assimilate and understand.

"Tell them about all of your ideas!" I thought to myself. *"Tell them how excited you are to hear their ideas and dreams and passions about how the Broadway Spirit might manifest itself in this new chapter we will write together."* *"Don't get ahead of yourself,"* I said to ... myself. *"Don't scare them off with visions and dreams and extraordinary hopes."* Oh the racing continued... 4,000 words per minute.

Thoughts of *"First Sunday coming... will anyone show?"* *"Maybe everyone could invite someone to come with them. I mean the more the merrier, right? What better chance to come see what's happening now?"* So many things could be written *"out loud."* *"Don't peak early,"* I thought. *"Short and sweet is the way to go. Short... and... sweet."* And so I decided to simply say this: Nice to meet you Broadway. I can't wait to see where God's going to lead us. Let's start with Sunday!

Southern Pilgrimage Inspires Local Walk

In early August, a group of 23 traveled from Columbia to visit historical civil rights locations in Tennessee and Alabama. It was an educational and emotional experience, as we saw places and towns where the worst of our national history and culture had been on full display. We also learned of places and times when our nation's capacity for kindness, justice and grace was evident, even on the worst of days. There is healing to do and justice to achieve, nationally and locally.

Local Civil Rights Pilgrimage

Growing from these experiences, a local Columbia Civil Rights Pilgrimage will take place on Sunday, September 22, beginning at 3:00 p.m. at St. Luke's Methodist Church. The Pilgrimage will lead participants through the area of Sharpend, Columbia's historically black neighborhood, and will include stops and tours of St. Luke's, St. Paul AME Church, Fifth Street Christian Church, Second Missionary Baptist Church and Russell Chapel. The Broadway Bus will be available for those who would find the walk difficult—please contact Don Day at 474.5539, by Wednesday, September 18, if you would like to ride the bus.

The CoMo Pilgrimage will begin and end at St. Luke's, with the entire Pilgrimage lasting approximately two hours. At the conclusion of the Pilgrimage, participants will gather at St. Luke's for a hymn sign and a dessert potluck. Please bring a dessert to share—you can drop it off at St. Luke's at the



beginning of the Walk.

Sunday, October 6: August Civil Rights Pilgrimage Lunch and Learn

Join us for lunch following worship on Sunday, October 6, for a look back at the August, 2019,

Civil Rights Pilgrimage and the historical, emotional and cultural lessons that were learned. Don Day, along with our Regional Minister Paul Koch, and other Pilgrimage participants will be present to share stories and pictures from the trip. This year's Pilgrimage group traveled to Memphis, TN, and Selma, Haynesville, Montgomery and Birmingham, AL to visit museums and historical sites important in the 1962 civil rights struggle. Along the way, the group was fortunate enough to speak with those who lived the history as children and young adults—each bringing their own truth and clarity to the story.

Members should park in the rear of the building.


