A Worship Enhancement for Kids!

Many recall, as young children, sitting next to their parents or grandparents in the church pew, holding a hymnal for mom and listening (*as best a child could*) to the pastor's sermon. Luckily, a parent would usually have a piece of paper and a pencil for doodling, and if you were really lucky, one or two peppermints. Some sermons were a one-minter; some were a two! Doodling and enjoying a mint or two is a good way to keep a restless child content. There is certainly joy in the experience of the whole family in worship. There is also value in our youngest children discovering gifts of worship at a developmental level that can speak to them in another unique way.

In March, Broadway Children's Ministries will launch *Children's Church*; a pilot program during the 11:15 worship hour. While children will always be welcomed for the duration of any of our worship services, we believe *Children's Church* offers a new choice for parents and families!

Children will begin worship in the sanctuary with their families. After the Children's Moment, our pastors will offering a children's blessing and release all who choose to accompany our *Children's Church* leaders to the Music Center for this worship enhancement opportunity. Our *All God's Children* program will continue to thrive and be available during this time as well.

Pre-kindergarten through third grade students are the intended focus for this new program. *Children's Church* will be held in the Music Center (*next to the Sanctuary*) where their experience will be modeled after "Big" Church, with our children hearing the same scriptures their families will hear in the sanctuary as well as key ideas from the sermon that families can discuss after worship. *Children's Church* will reflect other familiar elements of our Sunday worship as well, including singing, offering, prayer and communion.

This pilot program will run through May 31st with plans to evaluate the program at that time. As a worship enhancement experience, this is not intended to replace

the importance of the education and fellowship that comes during our regular Sunday School hour at 10:10 am. The purposes of Sunday School and *Children's Church* complement one another, both serving incredible purpose in the nurturing of our youngest disciples.

Because of the value of all generations sharing in worship together, there will be regularly scheduled Family Worship Sundays where the children will stay in the sanctuary to experience worship with the whole community; a chance for children to see how the worship practices they are learning are expressed within the larger community. Our children's choir may often share a gift of their music on these Sundays; songs they have been learning in *Children's Church*.

Children's Church will require a team of dedicated volunteers to make this new worship experience special for Broadway's children! Children's Ministries is seeking to fill five teams of three volunteers who will guide our youngest disciples through worship on a rotating schedule. May this new enhancement option for families bring new depth and blessing to our whole community. Whether you are a sports fan or not, it's hard not to have heard that our home state, Kansas City Chiefs, are Super Bowl champions. Growing up an anxious Chief's fan known for saying, "*There's always next year,*" it feels pretty amazing to say that *next year* is in fact, *this year*! My youngest son, Hayes, picked the hometown team to win by ten points. He was close! We celebrated with our Columbia family and enjoyed the fun that comes when your team wins. My three-year-old nephew, Oliver, was my closest companion during the game. Wearing proudly his Travis Kelce jersey, he whispered in my ear after the opening kick-off: "*Did we win yet?*" About every three or four minutes, Oliver returned to my side asking with all the hope in the world, "*Did we win yet?*" Unfortunately, he was asleep before I could confidently tell him, "Yes, Oliver. *We won!*"



Five months into our ministry partnership here at Broadway, several folks have begun asking me, "*Did we win yet, Pastor?*" They haven't phrased it quite that way but the hope-filled sentiment is there. "*Are we growing yet?*" "*Are you settling in okay?*" "*Do you think we could do this?*" One of my favorite versions of this question comes often from one of the youngest among us, a young man with a contagious smile who asks, "*Can we do it today?*" "*It*" might be sitting together or playing or singing or any number of things. It's hard not to feed off of his energy.

Are we winning yet? I'm not fully sure how to answer that question. I can say, however, that I'm

learning a lot. I can say how much I am amazed by your caring spirit for one another. I can say, worship is uplifting in every unique form offered by the fine people of our congregation for the glory of God. I can say how moving it was to watch, and serve alongside of you, at *Room at the Inn* or a church work day or in the good faith work of racial reconciliation. I can say how fun it has been to hear you tell stories about your "*Star Word*" or how you've invited a friend to join you

in worship or how excited you are to see what our visioning process reveals to us this year. "*Let's do something big!*" one person said. *That spirit. That heart.* If "*winning*" is even a thing in this regard, *that's it.* Your enthusiasm for your faith... to go deeper and grow wider; to serve more and sing with greater conviction; to welcome the *Other* and call each and all '*neighbor*'. "*Did we win yet?*" When it comes to our life together as Broadway Christian Church, I'm dying for Oliver to ask me that question. I'd love to share with him: "*Without a doubt, my nephew!*" God is good. Here's to being faithful again each and every tomorrow.

A Learning Opportunity for All of Us...

***The Milly Project* Comes to Broadway on March 1**

First—what is The Milly Project?

The Milly Project is an original stage production, written and performed by students of Willard High School. The play tells the story of Milly Sawyers, who was a slave in Springfield, Missouri, and who, two decades before the Dred Scott decision, sued for her freedom—and won.

Broadway will host a presentation of The Milly Project on Sunday, March 1, at 7:00 p.m. in our Sanctuary. There is no charge to attend and the public is invited.

“Play” not adequately describes The Milly Project. It is a fast-paced, tightly woven production, using drama, poetry, and music bringing Milly’s story to a



21st century audience. If you have seen or heard *Hamilton*, the production and writing of *The Milly Project* is reflective of that style of theater.

The students of Willard High School have performed their original production all

across Missouri, and have traveled to Mississippi and Alabama to share The Milly Project. The play began as a class project, following the discovery and publication of a yellowed and fading hand-written trial transcript from the 1830s. Fortunately for all of us, Milly’s struggle to win her freedom was not lost to history and is now speaking to today’s culture, as we continue to struggle with issues of equality and justice.

Anti-Racism Book Study Kicks Off February 9

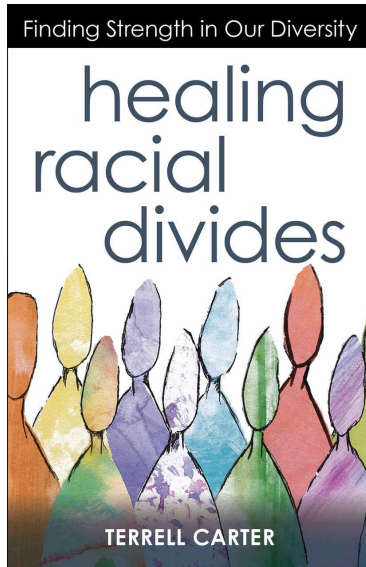
This Sunday, February 9, Broadway will begin its second book study on issues of race and culture with *Healing Racial Divides* by Dr. Terrell Carter. Our book study will begin with a kick-off event at 3:00 p.m. in the Broadway Sanctuary, when we will be joined by Dr. Carter to speak on the issues highlighted in his book.

Following Dr. Carter's talk and the discussion sure to follow, Mission and Outreach Ministry (MOM) is sponsoring a potluck dinner at 5:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. MOM will provide the main dish, and participants are asked to bring a side dish and/or dessert to share.

The anti-racism book studies will last approximately three months. At the end of May, Dr. Carter will return to Broadway, to hear our stories of shared study and conversation. He, and we, will get a before and after perspective on the book and how our reading and our discussions have made us more aware of racial division; and more importantly, how we can heal those divisions.

Our second book study will include at least 16 churches, both traditionally white and black congregations. The discussion groups will meet at a variety of times and intervals, but all with the goal of completing the book by the time Dr. Carter returns to Columbia.

The casserole ministry folks just take a 9x13 pan out of the freezer to thaw. It's the system and it works well.

Many Broadway members get to know CareLink during times when they are feeling great and all is well; except there's that gutter that has come loose from the soffit. Maybe they have a toilet that won't stop running (all together now—you'd better catch it!). They have discovered CareLink's compassion through the Handy Helpers, a group of retired men who are super at halting a running toilet or re-attaching a downspout.

Through CareLink and Spirited Singers, there are people who are treated to songs they remember and can sing along to at local care facilities. CareLink will also arrange for our members who are in those care facilities to have beautiful flowers delivered, or perhaps a personal visit, or both!

These acts of kindness and caring are just some of the ways CareLink and its volunteers care for those in our church family at Broadway. And if, like me, you read the numbers posted almost every month of those who have been helped and those who have volunteered, it will not surprise you to know that CareLink shares a compassionate touch over 1000 times during a year. What an amazing testament to the CareLink ministry of caring, and a shining example of the Broadway Spirit.

The cost for airfare to San Salvador costs around \$750-/ \$900; Mission and Outreach Ministry (MOM) will cover most, if not all, of lodging and food expenses for Broadway members.
