The meal served over 120 Grilled cheese sandwiches to at least 100 hungry patrons. Huge thank you to the Fellowship Committee for volunteering as our kitchen crew this year. It made a huge difference in the smoothness and success of the meal!

Christmas Pageant will be held on December 15 at the 9:00 & 11:15 service. We have 24 children from 4 years to 5th Grade in the Pageant with 6 participating in the youth support choir. Kay Cook and Ryan and Kimberly Kenney are working hard as our co-directors to get the children ready and we are so thankful for their talents.

Family Advent Party will be held during the Sunday school hour in lieu of Pathways and Worship and Wonder. This event is only successful with parent participation as we will have 4-5 crafts set up and several games that are self-led.

The children's Ministries Assistant job was posted two weeks ago. We have not had many qualified

applicants apply, but we are praying that the right person will respond soon. The position is for 15 hours a week, with flexible scheduling. Qualified applicants should have a strong sense of organization, The ability to work independently with direction, and be comfortable leading a Sunday school classroom.
