2023 - 2024 BUDGET - Mary Cunningham/Robin Perso

As of May 23, we have received 185 pledges totaling \$802,699.14. Of these 185 pledges: 63 increased, 16 decreased, 96 stayed the same, 5 were new pledges, 11 lost pledges, 5 "as can". Ingrid feels that a number of members are hesitant to commit while our church is in flux. The average pledged amount for 2023-24 is \$4,338.91, as opposed to \$3984.73 for 2022-2023.

It was moved by Ellen Flottman and seconded by Kristen Meade to accept the budget. The motion carried, though there were several opposed.
