“Aren’t we there yet?”

This question is traditionally posed by a child during the course of a long car trip, or traveling in an airplane or really at some point in every new opportunity. When we are children destinations serve to be our guiding star. The goal seems to be the end. We want to be at the end of elementary school or the end of High School. Graduation seems to be our focus and our desire. Yet, as we grow and mature, most start to realize that the journey is as important as the destination. That in some ways during this life, we spend our days writing and working on an “Ode to Not Yet.”

As I think back over my own desires to be “there” in my formative years, I realize that I wished I had paused a little more. I wish I had paid a little more attention to my history classes that seemed so boring to me at the time. Yet, now I buy books and wish for wise instruction about what has happened. Now with some years under my belt, I yearn for those moments where I get to focus on what I need to learn in this very moment.

In the Christian tradition, we are used to thinking about faith in these terms as well. Often the church refers to this as part of the Trinitarian nature of things. That in the beginning was the Creator or a new idea, and then it begins to take on practical forms, words on a page, actions in our lives, theologically this is the Christ in our midst, and then after that stage the Spirit, the Holy Spirit, takes a hold and blows where it will. That when we set out to create we never know where it will end up. A new idea forms, begins to take shape, and then connects with another. Only God knows where these will end up.

Sometimes when I am writing a sermon (or a newsletter article), I get stuck on the childlike idea of haven’t we arrived yet? Do we really have to go over what our vision and goals are again? Do we have to launch another fall kick-off series?

But then something comes over me, it is almost every time. This feeling on the back of my neck, that if I’m open to what is happening right here, in this very moment, then I will come to know and understand our God in deep and profound ways. If I push aside my personal desire to rush to an end, then I can enjoy that this is the day the Lord has made. Tomorrow will have enough for tomorrow, as today has enough for today.

As we prepare for our new beginnings, the start of a new school year, the welcoming of Mark as a new pastor, the launch of fall programming, we are each given an opportunity to not rush towards an ending. It is very easy to look ahead. This doesn’t mean we shouldn’t be excited about what is next, but it should be a reminder to open our collective eyes to what God is doing today. How is God in today inviting you into deep and profound places? Today, God is welcoming you to love your neighbor in countless ways. Today, God is calling you to sit with your excitement about what is to come and feel the goodness that comes with anticipation.

School years offer each of us an opportunity to reflect on where we’ve been this past year, and to look forward to forming new rhythms and routines. I want to invite you to listen to the whisper of God inside your head and heart and to not rush to fill your schedule, but to put in time to pause, to reflect. To invite God into this present moment. Set an alarm on your phone, mark it in your calendar, program it into your daily routine.

Take this beginning of a new school year (whether you are focused on the academic calendar or not) to slow down enough to not rush past what God is offering you today. Learn to listen to the wind. Learn to still the soul. Learn to appreciate what may be starting, and what parts may not yet come to fulfillment.

As we launch into our August sermon series, we’ll be examining how our God always builds upon what has been, and includes everything in the drawing of an even larger circle to include everything that was, and is, and invites us to be present with the Spirit now.

Dear Broadway,

A couple of weeks ago I sat in front of you and asked the children if I could tell them a story. I ask the same of you now. May I tell you a story?

He was the child that made teachers in our school cry. He didn't listen, he played rough, and most kids didn't want to be around him. I was not excited when I heard he was coming to me. I had heard the rumors, I had seen the proof, his needs were more than I knew how to support. How was I going to reach this child?

I'll tell you that I am not the first adult to feel this way when interacting with children of elevated needs. I am not the only person who has asked, "Is there a more 'adult' adult?" On one of these days, a colleague of mine escorted this boy from my classroom to another location in the building. I went to find my student during my break time and found him absorbed in a book being read aloud to him in a way I had never seen before. See, this boy couldn't read, which I knew, but he also had no one around to read to him. His mom, worked three jobs, and didn't have time to sit and read a story to her boy. That day I saw this child everyone labeled as a problem, as first and foremost a little boy.

As many of you know, I will be leaving Broadway Christian Church. It is very bittersweet, as I was just getting started. Before I go, I want to implore you see our AGC children as first and foremost, kids. The person who will replace me will need about 9 volunteers to support the ministry of All Gods Children.



This number of people would allow each person to serve on a monthly basis during the 10:10 Christian Education Hour, or the 11:10 All God's Children's Worship Hour.

As a volunteer, you are a 'buddy' for the kids. You are a person that is there to support them when a craft gets too tricky to

open, or to walk around the gym when sitting down is too tedious. During the AGC Worship Hour, you are the eyes of the teacher if students need an escort to the restroom, the hands to pass out markers, or press play on the CD player. You are the hands and feet of the ministry, doing the little things that make everything else successful.

Please consider deeply and pray into walking with this wonderful ministry. Contact Nick or Terry to let them know of your willingness and even eagerness to help.

Years ago the Prayer Shawl Ministry was established for just such needs. That ministry became part of CareLink. These beautiful shawls, lap robes and throws are created by our own church family members. Then they're blessed before being delivered to those who need the warmth of the love of our church family wrapped around them. This ministry works both ways. First, it gives peace to the creators of the shawls and makes good use of extra yarn that they may have. Second, it gives a person who may feel anxious, lonely, or in poor health, a comforting reassurance that they are not forgotten. They are embraced by their church family who holds them in prayer.

Just two years ago, a new version of the Shawl Ministry came upon the scene--Hug Buddies! Belinda Davis showed up with whimsical creatures created by her own hands. These cheerful critters feature all colors of yarn, eyes, ears and most distinctively, TAILS. Now who could feel "down" for long when someone hands you something that makes you smile and even laugh! Now other crafters are trying their hands at creating these characters.

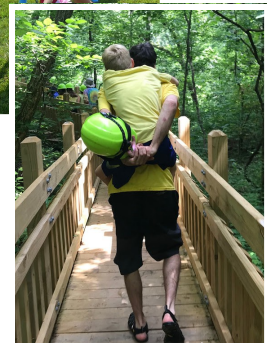
CareLink is for every family member of our church. Sometimes you are the one who can provide extra care or love and sometimes you are the one who may need that love.

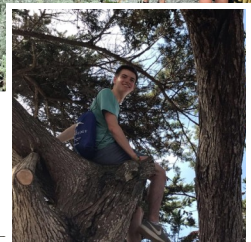
