Service Ministry Receives Reconciliation Grant

Reconciliation Special Offering Is September 24

On September 24, Broadway will hold a special offering for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) Reconciliation Ministry. The Reconciliation Ministry is a Disciples initiative to "discern the nature of racism in North America and to develop ways to help congregations address racism." To help congregations address racism, Reconciliation Ministry awards grants to churches who have submitted grant requests. Recently, Broadway's Service Ministry was awarded a Reconciliation Ministry grant!

Broadway's proposed program will engage African-American congregations with traditionally white congregations in a shared book study. The books will focus on aspects of racism in the United States, and how we, as Christians



can work to unify our churches and our country.

country, and indeed here in Columbia, families also face food insecurity. For many families, the choice between rent and food is very real. Local food pantries provide some help, but the need always seems to outstrip the supply of food on pantry shelves.

The CROP Hunger Walk on Sunday, September 17, has been working for the past 50 years to alleviate food insecurity. The Columbia CROP Walk will raise funds to assist Church World Service's global food ministry, as well as provide support for Loaves and Fishes Soup Kitchen, Latter House Food Pantry, Russell Chapel Food Pantry, Fifth Street Christian Church's Feed the Community and the Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture (CCUA).



Highlights From August Broadway Board Meeting

The Board of Broadway Christian Church met for its August 22 meeting in Fellowship Hall. The meeting was called to order by Board Chair John Poehlmann.

The meeting was opened with the Ministers Remarks.

Following the Ministers Remarks, a brief Board orientation was presented by John Poehlmann. John reviewed Board procedures and responsibilities. As well as the Broadway mission statement and Board member Code of Ethics.

Information Items

Front Porch Committee: Ed Stansberry provided an update on the work of the committee. Foundation and masonry work on the proposed permanent signage at Broadway and Heather Lane will be done by Coil Construction. Work will also be done on the Broadway sign to make it consistent with the new sign.

Property Ministry: Property Chair Mike Crews reported that Broadway has received a proposal from MBS Realty to use parking spaces on our north lot. MBS would construct a 400-foot sidewalk to connect

the lot to a new building that is proposed for their West Ash property that is adjacent to Broadway's property. Mike stressed that negotiations with MBS have just begun, and no recommendation from the Property Ministry will be made before all questions have been resolved.

Following the Information Items, each Ministry Area gave a short summary of ministry activities. Ministry report details are available in the complete Board minutes.

Action Item

Transportation Sub-Committee: Roger Wilson was approved as a Broadway Bus driver.

Charlottesville Statement: Senior Minister Tim
Carson read a draft of a statement regarding the
violence in Charlottesville. After some discussion, the
Board approved the drafting and publication of a
statement.

Following a prayer by Tim Carson, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m. Complete Board minutes are available on request or may be viewed in the Thursday *Broadway Weekly* e-news.
