- CareLink continues to touch the lives of our congregants with compassionate care via our thirteen different ministries and an average of 163 volunteers on a monthly basis.

- All God's Children Ministry continued its partnership with MU to host student interns to aid in supporting disability and inclusion within our faith community. AGC recently hosted a Night of the Arts event and plan other events to promote inclusion and accessibility.

OUTREACH & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

BCC volunteers extending a broad reach in the community serving through Mobile Food Pantry, Loaves & Fishes, Ronald McDonald, Wardrobe, Mobility Worldwide, Racial Reconciliation, Community Gardens and more:

- Total outreach number for 2021-2022 is **\$195,487.64** of which \$93,534.15 was given through MOM to 37 organizations/causes in Columbia.
- Over \$35K was raised for Habitat For Humanity
- Over The Edge event raised \$6,625.00 for Love Columbia
- Host for Room at The Inn during January
- Via Tree of Hope, 75 children received gifts, gift cards and made their Christmas a bit brighter
- Numerous BCC members volunteered to participate in *For Columbia*, a day of service with neighbors helping neighbors in various projects around the City.
- Special Offerings (Haiti/Afghanistan/KY tornadoes) totaled \$10,081.75

Vision in Action



The Imaginarium Team continues to move forward with a listening pilgrimage whose mission is to imagine collectively Broadway's reach into our community. The team has completed one "round" of listening sessions with two distinct groups of Broadway members, and is preparing for a second round with three more groups over the summer months.

Our **Multi-Racial/Ethnic Priority Action Team** has supported the existing work of Broadway-led community group, Race Onward, focused on understanding and fighting racism in the world. This Priority Action Team has focused on matters of worship and hospitality that might encourage greater participation of a wider array of people. Specifically designed worship services including "A Gospel Christmas" and "Black Dad. White Dad" on Juneteenth are two primary examples. Together @ 10:10 was an additional expression of worship that featured Future Soul musicians J Artiz and the Mo Soul Collective. Other hopes for fellowship, worship and community events are eagerly anticipated.

The Affirming LGBTQIA+ Persons and Families Team has been working to find ways to include people from all groups and to ensure that Broadway is Open and Affirming both in name and in action:

- developed nametags that indicate BCC is open and affirming
- started including pronoun stickers at the welcome table
- working to get listed on the Disciples Alliance website as an open and affirming church so that members of this community can easily find us.

Green Chalice/Ecological Stewardship Team is assembling bids for the renovation of lighting in our building in phases. This will be another step toward achieving the covenantal agreement to become a Green Chalice Congregation. Thanks to the many groups who have reduced our carbon footprint in recycling and materials choices.

The Every Ability Flourishes Team is working to promote inclusion and accessibility across the life of the church. In partnership with MU's Department of Occupational Therapy, group members helped co-host a Community Conversation on Disability, Inclusion and Faith Communities last fall. We've recently completed a congregational survey whose data will inform a strategic plan to help every ministry area become truly inclusive and accessible for all gifts and abilities.

Front Porch/Facilities Enhancements Team have already begun to imagine how our facility serves our ultimate vision.

- priorities continue to surface and expand.
- enhancing our website and virtual presence is in progress
- expanded our presence with new outdoor banners
- consulted with Randy Coil who lead the team on a tour of two other churches in town that offered great possibilities for what could be done at BCC to enhance usability, functionality, and accessibility.
- creation of a Master Plan for our building and grounds intended as growing next steps.
