Lent @ Broadway

The season of Lent is a deeply reverent and reflective journey for people of the Christian faith. Typically named as a forty day season from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, this six week journey mirrors the deeply focused time Jesus spent in the wilderness prior to the launch of his ministry. Lent often includes special services, study, prayer, fasting and other spiritual disciplines. You are humbly and whole-heartedly invited to experience the gifts of the season with us at Broadway Christian Church. The following details some opportunities unique to the season:

Ash Wednesday: February 17

Noon – 1:00 p.m.: Reflective Prayer & Blessing

Walk. Come to the Outdoor Worship Area at Broadway any time during the lunch hour to experience a guided prayer walk. Our pastors will guide each person through in a safe and socially distanced manner. There will be reflective practices, a moment fireside, and a blessing as you part that includes ashes to self-administer the sacred marking of the cross on your forehead. Each participant should allow 10-15 minutes for this experience.

6:00 p.m. – Virtual Worship Service. Join us on our YouTube channel for a thirty minute service including meditations by our pastors, Taize music, and the liturgical meaning of Ash Wednesday.

6:45-7:15 p.m. – Drive Through Ashes. For those not able to join the Noon prayer walk, our pastors will meet you under the covered portico in this thirty minute window following the virtual service to share an ash kit and offer a blessing. You will never have to get out of your vehicle!

Wednesday Windows

The five Wednesdays between Ash Wednesday and Holy Week will offer a brief mid-week meditation by


our Pastors as they “*Pray the Windows*” of our city. Video Meditations will be shared via email by Noon each Wednesday and can be viewed at your convenience. Glean further insight into the Lenten season and join in the prayers at various windows of Columbia from City Hall, local schools, health departments and beyond. Opportunities for church members to partner with our Home Centered members in the sharing of these meditations are available and encouraged.

Easter Sunday: April 4

While the season will mostly feature virtual opportunities for worship and connection, the desire is to gather in-person on Easter Sunday, April 4, “*On the Hill*.” Weather permitting, this socially distanced, BYOC (*Bring Your Own Chair/Communion*) worship gathering will be held in our Outdoor Worship Space at 10:30 a.m. Masks and physical distancing required. Virtual Worship Options at our usual times will be available as well.

Introducing Our Lenten Sermon Series: Windows

We've been looking through windows for almost an entire year. COVID restrictions keep us separated. Most often our closest touch comes with a pane of glass between pressed hands. Such a pane has brought deep pain to so many isolated from the world with nothing but a windowed view of life on the other side of the window. Our faith is seen through a variety of windows as well. Scripture opens up helpful views for our spiritual, emotional and relational healing. The season of Lent is a deep dive into the window of the soul. What will we see? Through what lens will we see the world; each other; even Jesus the Christ? Join us on a forty day trek through the cross to the empty tomb in a series simply called, “*Windows*.”



My Regards...

The eagerness to put 2020 officially in the history books was one many shared. What a year!?! Thank God we were turning the page to a new year with new hopes, new health, and new possibility. Things looked so great. We were lining up to get vaccines, the Chiefs were primed for another Super Bowl run and Broadway was prepping to unleash a new Vision! 2020 was over. Problems left behind. Wide-open possibilities ahead of us.

Then? *January*. Insurrection at the Capitol. COVID soars. Missouri in the news for all of the less than flattering reasons. Yay, 2021?

The humble reminder crashed close to home: *Change is hard and... change takes time*. The reality is that hope comes alongside our hurts and works its healing process over time. All we imagined for 2021 is on its way. Will it end up looking like we thought from the start? Probably not. But it *is* coming.

Author Bob Goff plays a game with himself a dozen times a day. Whenever he walks into a new space, he tries to figure out where north is. He guesses and then pulls out his compass to confirm, or deny, his sense of direction. Beyond a fun game that has amused him over and over again, it tees up another question: *"Where are you?"* There's the obvious physical location. You're in your home; at the office; spilling coffee on this newsletter as you read. He speaks to the deeper question of where you currently are.

- *Are you in a job that's sucking you bone dry, but you don't know how you'll pay rent or the mortgage without it? That's where you are.*
- *Are you in a toxic relationship but are so exhausted or have grown so codependent that you stay? That's where you are.*
- *Are you still believing you don't have what it takes to achieve your big vision? That's where you are.*

Among the others Goff shared, that last one stopped



me in my tracks. As we rolled out Broadway's new Vision during January, this location was present at the front of my heart, mind and soul. I said to myself: *"Self, this is a big vision. Do we have what it takes?"* That's where I was. Our identity statement, supporting core values and tagline seem spot on. You rallied together and have said, *"Yes! This is who we are!"* That was Vision Packet Page One. The ensuing five pages opened more eyes. What is this *"Master Narrative?"* and *"Is that even possible?"* It does paint a broad and wide picture of what we could become. An accompanying big gulp reading through it is understandable. Important to note, however, is that the presented Master Narrative is not a blueprint or a strategic plan. It's just an inspired story; a collection of ideas and dreams shared during a year long visioning process as a congregation. Our current Faith Formation groups are diving deeper into the Vision and creating their own Master Narratives as part of the inspired process. What joy!!!

Whatever story we live into as the people of Broadway, I pray it is one that stretches us, inspires us and challenges us to go beyond our comfort zones. God meets us on that frontier's edge and reminds us we have all we need within and among us to become all that Love will lead us to become. 2021 didn't magically make everything better, clearer, cleaner, or achievable. But... it's coming. While January held some of the same hurts of 2020, it introduced great hopes too. Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman reminds us, *"We're not broken... just unfinished."* Chad Henne clinches a win as Patrick Mahomes enters concussion protocol (#Hennethingispossible) and Patrick carries the Chiefs to another Super Bowl (BEL15VE!). And the Vision? Well... people are starting to see it. Dream it. Claim it. Own it. Become it. As the prophet Habakkuk says about such grand vision? *"If it seems slow in coming, wait. It's on its way. It will come right on time."* This is where we are. This, my friends, is hope.



technology and we will have four touch points during the day for those with computer access.


Either way, our hearts will be **united** on that day.

CareLink IS the Spirit of the Living God!

You know, sometimes things just seem to fall into place. Here's my latest example of just that. I was sitting in our kitchen last Sunday morning participating in the 10:30 virtual worship and I was thinking about what to say in this article. And then the musicians began singing one of my absolute favorite hymns, "Spirit of the Living God."

The first thing I noticed was that in their version of the lyrics, they sang, "Spirit of the living God, fall fresh on me." In my vast musical career as a youth group teenage singer around a campfire, we always sang, "fall afresh on me." It stuck in my mind all these years because it was unique. "Afresh" somehow sounded more sophisticated.

But what really struck me was, "This hymn is talking about CareLink at Broadway." It's describing "church family caring for church family," the very description of what CareLink's mission has always been. Of course the hymn, written in 1926 by Daniel Iverson, a Presbyterian minister, came long before CareLink. Yet this long-lasting chorus embodies a simple sincerity and its melody uses only five notes, with every pitch in its

place. I think that's why I have loved it for so many years.

"Spirit of the Living God,
Fall afresh on me.
Melt me, mold me, fill me, use me.
Spirit of the living God,
Fall afresh on me."

All those CareLink volunteers can feel the spirit of the living God falling afresh. They know they have been molded, filled with God's love and that they are willingly used to comfort others in bereavement, to pray for them, call them, visit them, send them cards, sing for them, provide meals and shawls and flowers and handy helpers and support.

These past few months have brought many challenges to our CareLink volunteers but they're up for the challenges. They keep going because they are being filled with God's love. If You Will Trust in God to Guide You

1 *If you will trust in God to guide you, and hope in God through all your ways, God will give strength, whate'er betide you, and bear you through the evil days. Who trusts in God's unchanging love builds on the rock that will not move.*

2 *God will embrace your pain and weeping, your helpless anger and distress. If you are in God's care and keeping, in sorrow will God love you less? For Christ, who took for you a cross, will bring you safe through every loss.*

3 *Sing, pray, and keep God's ways unswerving; so do your own part faithfully, and trust God's word; though undeserving, you'll find God's promise true to be. God never will forsake in need the soul that trusts in God indeed.*

We are entering this sacred season of Lent, a time to pause, deeply reflect, and commune with God. Lent gives us another opportunity to embrace all that it means to trust in God. Trust that God will give us strength to live these days and to help us change and grow. Trust is a familiar theme in both hymnody and praise song and that is not surprising. During times of trouble, difficulty, and pain, trusting God can be challenging. Having poetry and song to reference can be tremendously comforting. Certainly one text that has stood the test of time is Georg Neumark's *If You Will Trust in God to Guide You*.

Georg Neumark was no stranger to the many trials we can face during our lifetimes. He lived in Germany, during the time of the Thirty Years' War, a time of serious economic difficulty. It is also estimated that between 4-8 million people died by war, disease and famine (<https://www.history.com/topics/reformation/thirty-years-war>). He also fell into great personal misfortune, robbed of most of his possessions early in his adult life, struggled to find work, and then lost all of his possessions, again, in a fire at his home. It was at the end of this period that he composed the tune and wrote this text on trust. Catherine Winkworth (1827-1878), English hymn writer and educator, and a strong supporter of educational rights for girls, did the original translation. Our Chalice hymnal uses a translation by Jeroslav Vajda (1919-2008), American hymn writer and son of a Lutheran pastor, for the second verse of this hymn. His translation provides great hope in times of trial and assures us of God's love.

What is the promise? Trusting God gives us strength. God promises to embrace our pain, our helpless anger, our distress, our sorrow and promises love throughout our entire lifetime. The hymn also invites us to sing, pray and keep God's ways, and to do our part, whatever that may be. This Lenten season, let us renew our trust in God to guide us, and explore in new ways our place, our part, and our calling in God's world as well as in this faith community. Amen!


