Co-Occurring Mental & Substance Use Disorders in Child and Adolescent Behavioral Health

Course Description

This course will look at individual factors for children, adolescents, teens, and transition-age youth that increase risk for co-occurring mental and substance use disorders (COD). Factors that affect services delivery at the individual, family, agency, community, and systems levels will be investigated. Course content will also look at the history and development of the COD service delivery systems for this population, the evolution of evidence-based practices, and policy and funding issues.

Who Should Take this Course

This course is appropriate for graduate-level students, seeking a 3-credit elective course and interested in:

- Co-occurring disorders and their impact on children and adolescents and their families.
- Mental disorders and their treatment or service needs.
- Treatment and program development for those with drug and alcohol misuse.



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
