Bryan Victor, Ph.D., MSW is an associate professor in the School of Social Work at Wayne State University where he also holds an appointment as a faculty affiliate with the Merrill Palmer Skillman Institute for Child & Family Development. His most recent work is focused on how human service organizations adopt and integrate artificial intelligence (AI) within their workflows, the perceived utility of AI tools among clinical social workers, and emerging state-level regulatory schemes around AI and the provision of mental health services. Dr. Victor currently serves as the lead editor for a specialty series on AI and social work at the Journal of the Society for Social Work and Research and as a member of the CSWE Taskforce on Technology and Social Work Education. His prior and current work in child welfare and maltreatment prevention has been funded by federal, state, and foundation partners including the U.S. Children’s Bureau, the Health Resources and Services Administration, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
