Bio: Dr. Molly Franke, an epidemiologist and Associate Professor in Global Health and Social Medicine at Harvard Medical School, talk about her research to improve the health of children and adolescents affected by TB and HIV. For nearly 20 years she has collaborated with Socios En Salud in Lima, Peru on to reduce stigma and improve the well-being of adolescents and young adults living with HIV through the provision of community-based accompaniment and through youth-friendly modalities, such as music videos and social media. Description: Evidence-based interventions to support treatment and care for adolescents and young people living with HIV in Latin America are sparse. Dr. Franke will provide an overview of intervention research designed to provide psychosocial, logistical, and adherence support to a diverse population of adolescents living with HIV in urban, Peru. She will describe research-related challenges and strategies to ensure that interventions are "adolescent friendly."
