“Advancing the Effectiveness and Implementation of Dementia Care Innovation”



Dr. Joseph Gaugler received his PhD in 1999 from Pennsylvania State University in Human Development and Family Studies and currently is the Robert L. Kane Endowed Chair in Long-Term Care & Aging in the Division of Health Policy and Management and School of Public Health at The University of Minnesota. He also holds a joint appointment in the School of Nursing and is an Honorary Professor at the University of Queensland, Australia. He directs the Center for Health Aging and Innovation (CHAI) and the CDC-funded BOLD Public Health Center of Excellence on Dementia Caregiving at the University of Minnesota. His research examines caregiving issues and long-term care quality for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias (ADRD) with a particular emphasis on minority aging. He has consistently been federally funded for the last 20 years by NIH, Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality and Department of Defense. He currently has 10 active funded federal grants from sources including National Institute on Aging, Department of Defense and Health Services Resources Administration (HRSA). He is the Co-Lead on the Implementation Core of the NIA funded IMPACT Collaboratory for pragmatic trials related to ADRD research. Dr. Gaugler has published approximately 150 articles, five books, 40 book chapters and several technical reports. He is currently the Senior Associate Editor for the Journal of the American Medical Directors Association and a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America and American Psychological Association.
